CHRIST AS FULFILLING SCRIPTURE: TEACHING

- 1. Jesus describes a shift in the disciple's worldly relationship (Vs 35-36)
 - a) He reminds them of his provision and the worlds acceptance (Vs 35)
 - b) He explains the open hostility the world will now have for his followers (Vs 36)

CHRIST AS FULFILLING SCRIPTURE: TEACHING

- 2. Jesus explains the reason for this shift (Vs 37)
 - a) Scripture is fulfilled in Christ.
 - b) Scripture *must* be fulfilled in Christ.
 - c) Scripture is Christ.
- 3. The Scripture Jesus references is the "Passion Prophecy" of Isaiah 53.

 - a) The Narrative focused on Him (39)
 - b) Jesus Practiced what he Preached (40)
 - c) Prayer was a private thing for Christ in times of trouble (41)

CHRIST AND FAITHFUL PRAYER: TEACHING

- 2. Jesus entered Spiritual Warfare (Vs 42-44)
 - a. Jesus raised his request and struggle to his "Father" (42a)
 - b. Jesus submitted to His Fathers Will (Vs 42b)
 - c. The presence of a divine being points towards Jesus Temptation in the desert (Vs 43)
 - d. Jesus experienced great fear, emotional pain, and spiritual agony leading up to the cross (Vs 44)
 - i. But ultimately Satisfaction (Isaiah 53)

CHRIST AND FAITHFUL PRAYER: TEACHING

- 3. The Disciples prayer experience is markedly different (Vs 45-46)
 - a) They were spiritually as well as physically asleep. (45)
 - b) The disciples fell into the temptation that Jesus fought. (46)
