
Acts 3:11-26

While he clung to Peter and John, all the people, utterly astounded, ran together to them in the portico called Solomon's. 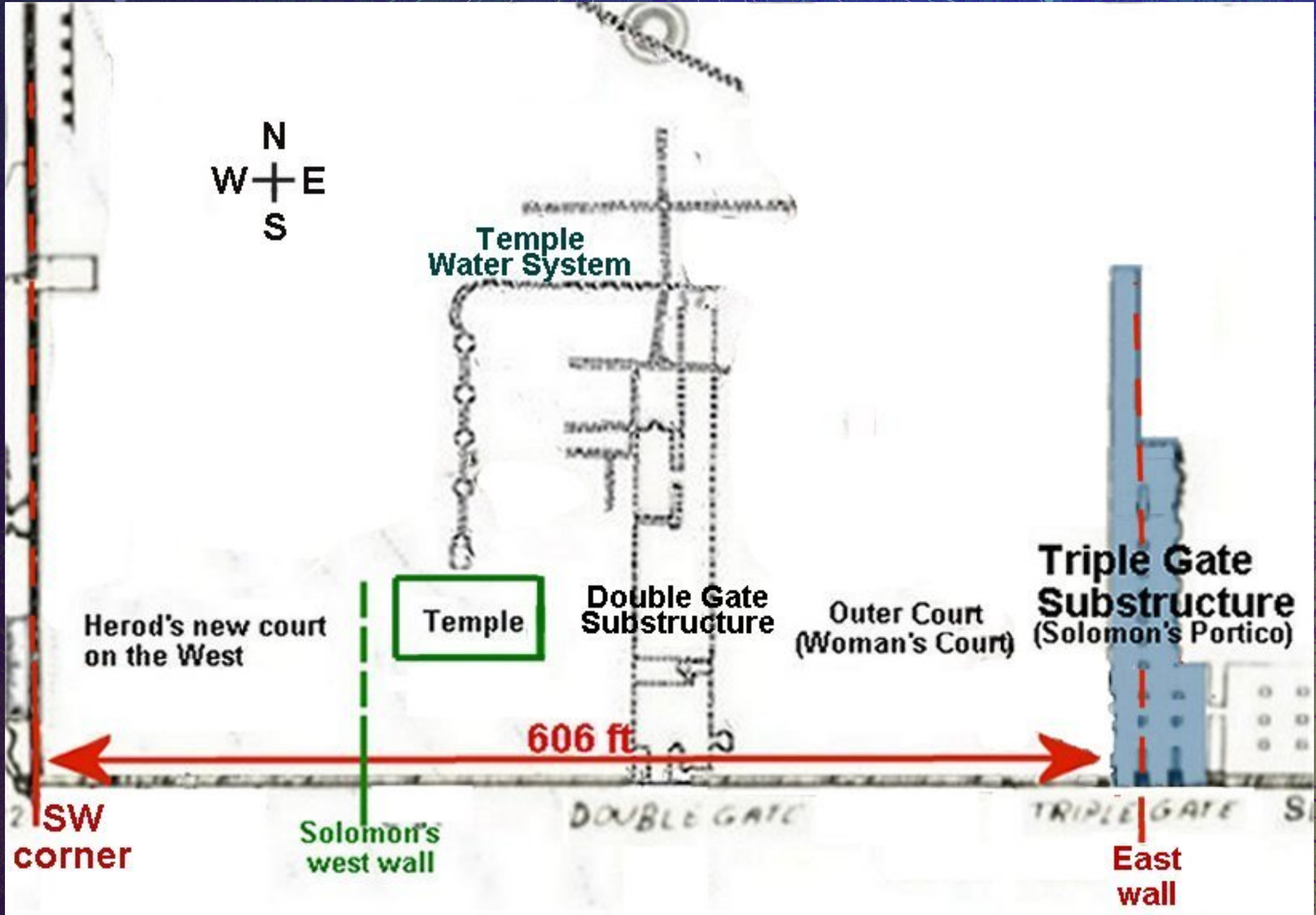

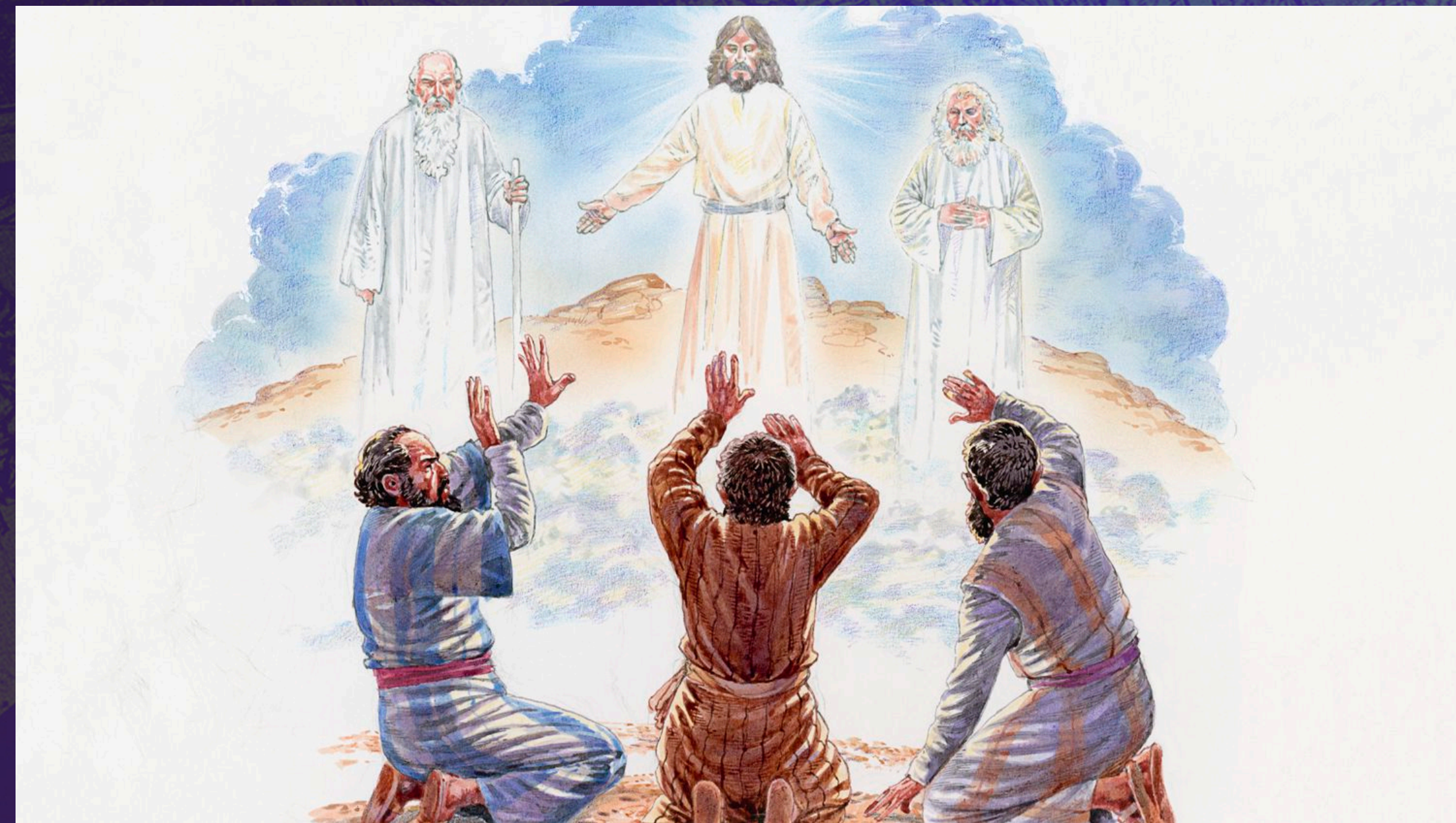
Christ is the Author of life.


