



ACTS 13:32-41 The Whole Word

Psalm 2:7 - The Coronation of Christ (Identity)
Isaiah 55:3 - The Covenant Fulfilled (Promise)
Psalm 16:10 - The One True King (Victory)
Habakkuk 1:5 - The Ultimate Rejected Work (Warning)

Why This Matters: Paul didn't cherry pick. He shows how all Scripture points to Christ. Every promise, every psalm, every prophecy finds its "yes and amen" in Jesus.

Stop treating the Bible like a fortune cookie. When you read Scripture this week, ask "How does this point to Jesus?", not "How does this relate to me personally?"

ACTS 13:42-47 Rejection of The Word

Selective Hearing - I embrace what affirms me but resist what confronts me.

Competitive Spirit - I resent "unworthy" people receiving what I've "earned".

Hostile Opposition - I actively argue against truths that threaten my worldview.

Self-Exclusion - I judge myself unworthy of eternal life by rejecting the Gospel.

Rejection rarely begins with outright denial. It starts with selective obedience. This week, identify one Biblical truth you've been negotiating with rather than submitting to. Write it down and pray daily for a surrendered heart.

ACTS 13:42-49 Acceptance of The Word

The Heart's Response - From shallow excitement to deep roots.

The Mind's Response - From curious interest to passionate devotion.

The Will's Response - From passive hearing to active proclamation.

Sanctification is a process that begins at salvation and lasts forever. This week, examine which response level you're at and take one concrete step deeper.

ACTS 13:50 Revolt of The World

Soft Opposition - Social pressure and cultural mockery.

Hard Opposition - Economic and political consequences.

Final Opposition - Legal persecution and physical danger.

Prepare for tomorrow's battles by faithfully enduring today's. Identify your current opposition and pray specifically for courage.

ACTS 13:51-52 Victory of The Word

By Judgment - Shaking dust is an Old Testament prophetic act declaring God's judgment.

By Advance - The Word cannot be contained to one city, people, or culture.

By Transformation - The Holy Spirit fills the rejected messengers with supernatural joy.

Victory in God's Kingdom looks like defeat to the world. Identify one area where you're using worldly measurements for spiritual success. Replace those measurements with Biblical ones this week.
