

And now, Lord, look upon their threats and grant to your servants to continue to speak your word with all boldness, while you stretch out your hand to heal, and signs and wonders are performed through the name of your holy servant Jesus." And when they had prayed, the place in which they were gathered together was shaken, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and continued to speak the word of God with boldness.



#### Context Within Acts

- Acts 1: The Church before the Holy Spirit; Weak, Inward-focused, waiting for something to happen.
- Acts 2: The Coming of the Holy Spirit; The Church invigorated into prophetic preaching that changed lives with God's presence.
- Acts 3: A Snapshot of the Early Days; Wondrous miracles confirmed the truth of what the Apostles Preached: Jesus was the Messiah.
- Acts 4:1-22: The World Strikes Back; Offended by their teachings of Christ's exclusivity, the religious leaders of the day attempt to silence the Apostles.

#### Verse Breakdown 23

- Vs. 23: This was the first example of persecution that the church ever experienced.
- Vs 23: Understandably, Peter and John immediately went to report, discuss, and respond to the situation with the early church leaders.

Public Proclamation of the Word will always be met with hostility from people both outside and inside the church.

## Verse Breakdown 24-27

- Vs 24-25a: The Church responded to this new hardship through God-Focused, Scripture-Based Prayer.
- Vs 25b-26: Psalms 2 is a reminder that despite their plans and machinations, The Son will always triumph over the rulers of this world.
- Vs 27-28: By connecting the truth of Scripture with their circumstances, the church was comforted by God's Plan.

It is essential, through Prayer and Scripture reading, to be reminded of how God has chosen to respond to a world full of evil, sin, and hardships. [24] And when they heard it, they lifted their voices together to God and said, "Sovereign Lord, who made the heaven and the earth and the sea and everything in them, [25] who through the mouth of our father David, your servant, said by the Holy Spirit,

## Verse Breakdown 29-31

- Vs 29: Having approached God by affirming who he is, the Church addresses their fear.
- Vs 30: The prayer ends with a request for the continuation of the Great Commission.
- Vs 31: God responded to their prayer by drawing attention to his continual presence.

God's presence will move our prayer to a place where one day all we'll pray for is God's presence.
