A C T S 8 : 2 6 - 4 0

²⁶ Now an angel of the Lord said to Philip, “Rise and go toward the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza.” This is a desert place. ²⁷ And he rose and went. And there was an Ethiopian, a eunuch, a court official of Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, who was in charge of all her treasure. He had come to Jerusalem to worship ²⁸ and was returning, seated in his chariot, and he was reading the prophet Isaiah. ²⁹ And the Spirit said to Philip, “Go over and join this chariot.”

³⁰ So Philip ran to him and heard him reading Isaiah the prophet and asked, “Do you understand what you are reading?” ³¹ And he said, “How can I, unless someone guides me?” And he invited Philip to come up and sit with him. ³² Now the passage of the Scripture that he was reading was this: “Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter and like a lamb before its shearer is silent, so he opens not his mouth. ³³ In his humiliation justice was denied him. Who can describe his generation? For his life is taken away from the earth.”

³⁴ And the eunuch said to Philip, "About whom, I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?" ³⁵ Then Philip opened his mouth, and beginning with this Scripture he told him the good news about Jesus. ³⁶ And as they were going along the road they came to some water, and the eunuch said, "See, here is water! What prevents me from being baptized?" ³⁷ And Philip said, "If you believe with all your heart, you may." And he replied, "I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God."

³⁸ And he commanded the chariot to stop, and they both went down into the water, Philip and the eunuch, and he baptized him. ³⁹ And when they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord carried Philip away, and the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing. ⁴⁰ But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he passed through he preached the gospel to all the towns until he came to Caesarea.

become Bible scholars all of us
should be Bible students.**

**God has provided a pathway for
people to believe the story of Jesus.
We must familiarize ourselves with
His truth to tell the story of Jesus.**

**III. Telling the story of Jesus
is a Christ-centered experience.
(v.v. 35–38)**

**We can easily become
preoccupied with topics which
have little impact on eternity.**

**III. Telling the story of Jesus

**God has perfected the plan for people to
believe and receive the story of Jesus.
Those who have experienced Jesus want
to tell the story of Jesus.**

APPLICATION

STEP 1: Gather information — get intel.

“What do you mean by that?”

Become familiar and comfortable
with asking questions.

APPLICATION

STEP 2: Find out the reasons why they believe what they are saying.

You are not advancing your view but listening to them and seeking to understand.

APPLICATION

STEP 3: Use questions to make a point.

How far should you go
in the current conversation?

APPLICATION

Viabile — what is possible — Nothing is impossible with God. (Luke 1:37)

Visible — what is perceivable — Taste and see that the Lord is good. (Psalm 34:8)

Valuable — what is probable — One plants, another waters, but God gives the increase. (1 Corinthians 3:6)
