


Rejoice in the Lord alway: and again say, Rejoice. Philippians 4:4

They read from the book, from the Law of God, clearly, and they gave the sense, so that the people understood the reading. So the Levites calmed all the people, saying, "Be quiet, for this day is holy; do not be grieved." (Nehemiah 8:8-11 ESV)
