Definition

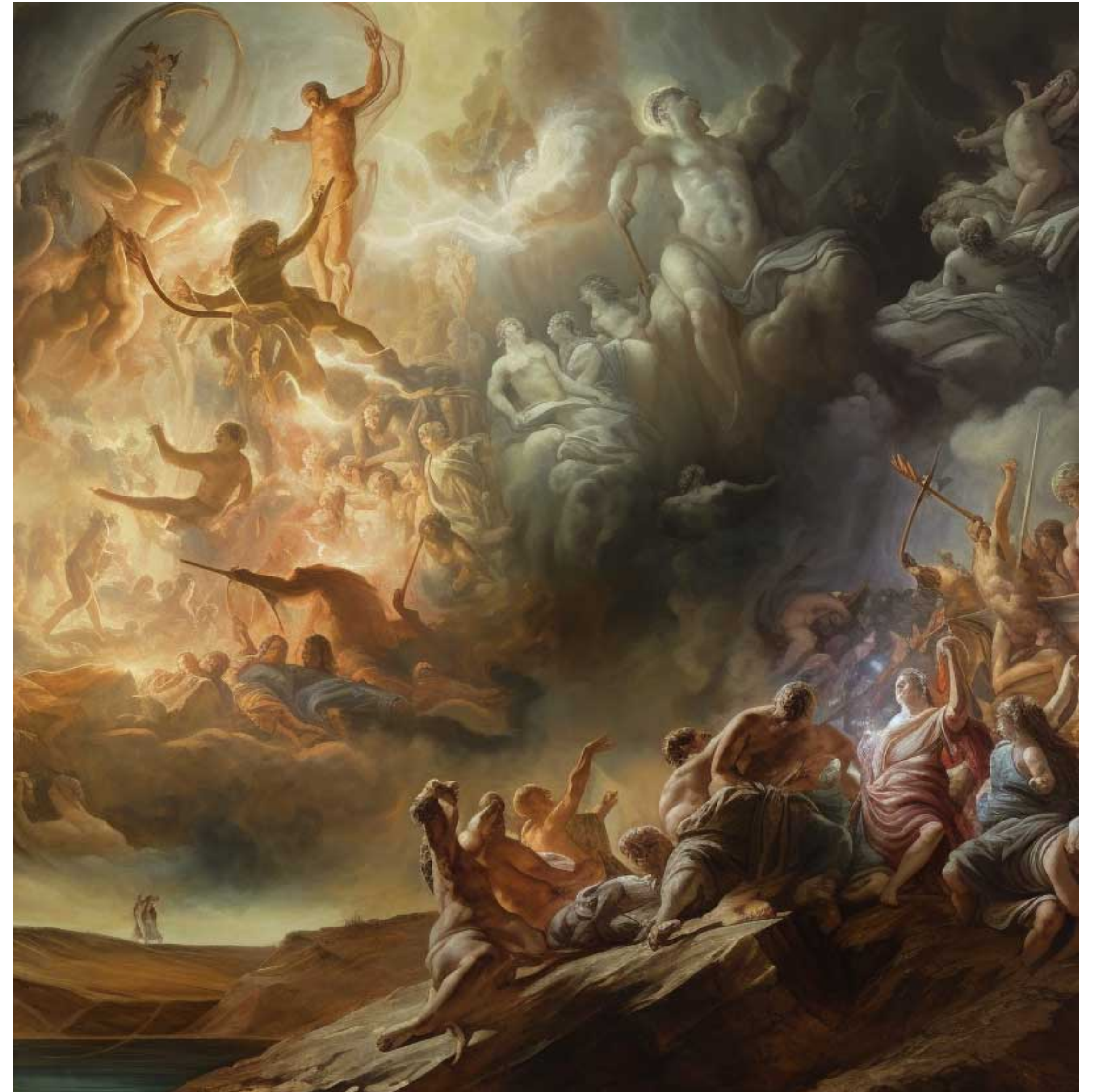
*Turning away the

offering of blood.*

The Problem

Our Sin and God's Wrath

- **Provoked:** Our sin provokes God's righteous wrath.
- **Persistent:** God's holiness cannot ignore or overlook sin.
- **Powerless:** None of our offerings can turn away God's wrath.

Key Scriptures: Romans 1:18

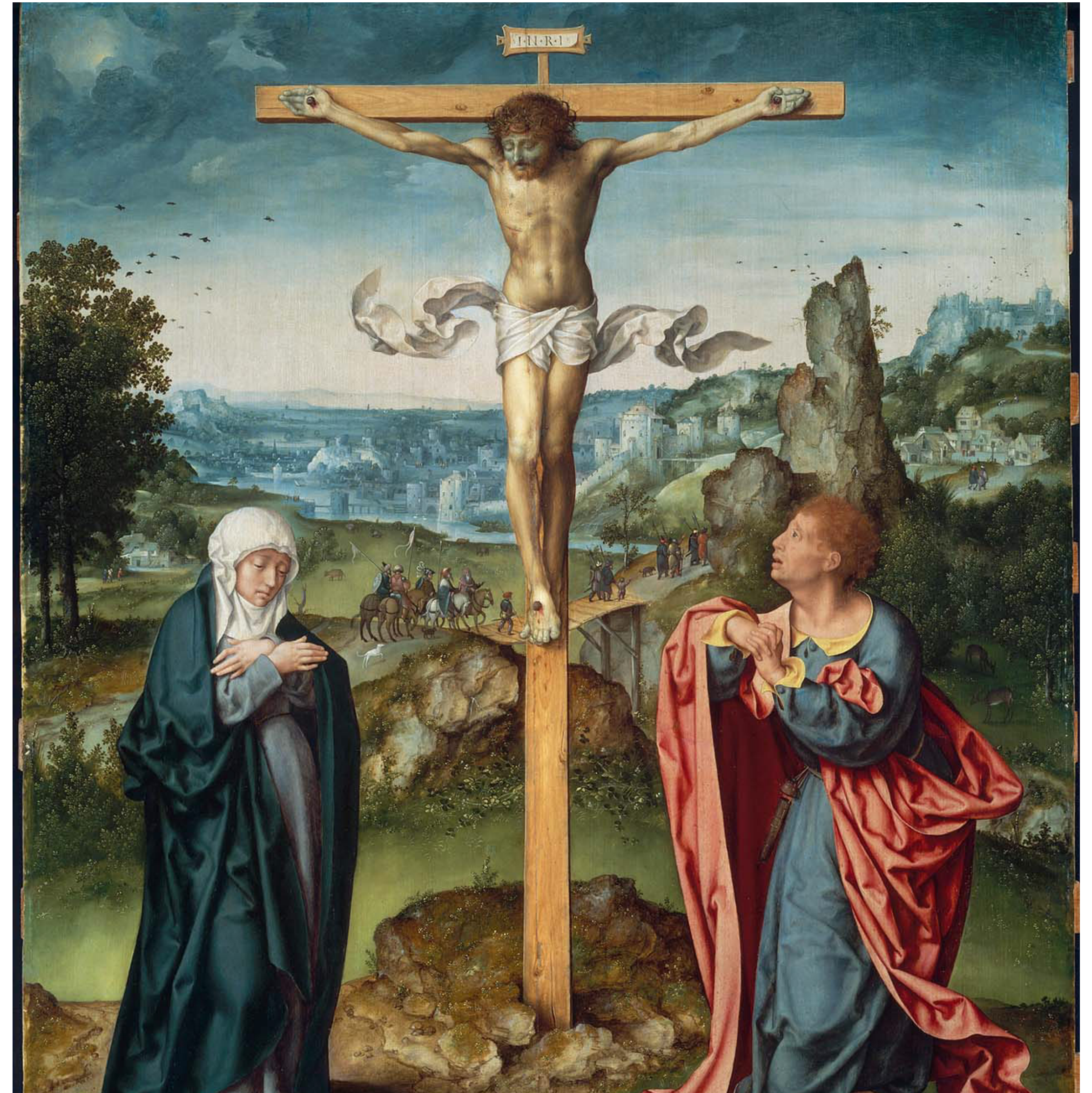


The Solution

Christ and the Cross

- **Substitutionary:** Jesus offered to take our place to receive God's wrath.
- **Sacrificial:** Jesus' blood was spilled as the necessary sacrificial offering.
- **Satisfactory:** Jesus' death completely satisfied God's wrath.

Key Scriptures: 1 John 2:2, 1 John 4:10, Romans 3:25

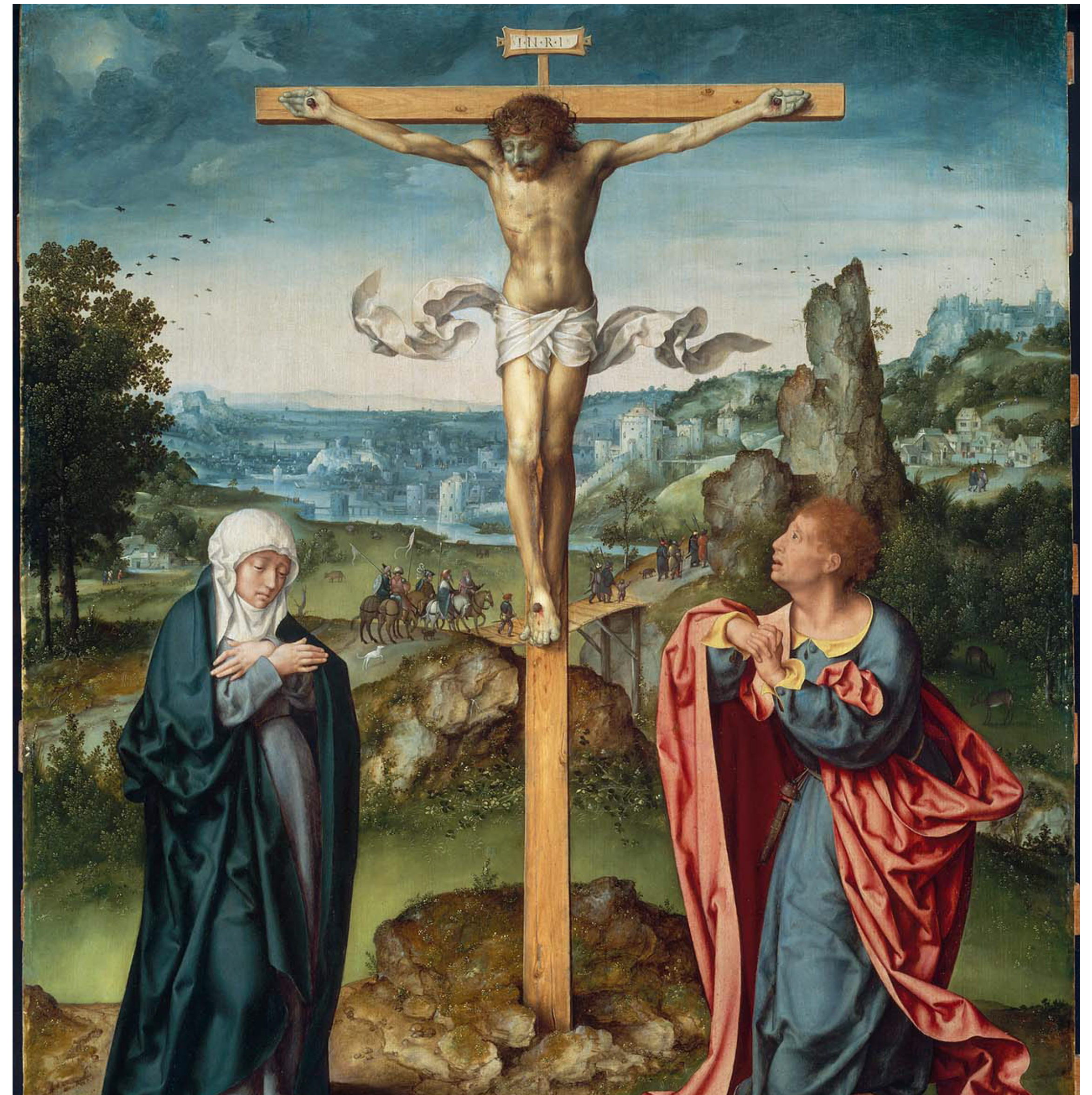


The Result

God's Great Love

- God's love initiated the propitiation, not the other way around.
- Our relationship with God, broken by our own sin, is restored as a free gift.

Key Scriptures: Romans 5:1



Why Does Propitiation Matter

- 1. Salvation:** Propitiation shows us how God can save us, total sinners, while still fully punishing sin as a just and righteous God!
- 2. Assurance:** Propitiation promises us that since God's wrath is completely satisfied in Christ, we are completely safe in our salvation!
- 3. Worship:** Propitiation encourages us to Worship the God who initiated our salvation in the midst of our rebellion!
