- 1. Why is it significant to live with the reality that God does what God does when and how He chooses? Why do we struggle so with God being in control?
- 2. What are ways and situations where you know God has used His Word in practical and powerful ways? Share.
- 3. Take a risk and be vulnerable about how God has restored you from a regret or resentment. Why is it so hard to overcome stubborn regrets and resentments?
- 4. How did Jesus restore Peter? (Verses 15-19)
- 5. Why was it important for Peter to not worry about what would happen to John? (Verses 20-22)
- 6. Have you ever believed something to be true and later discovered it was a bunch of hot air? Are there things that are important to you that are none of your busines? (Verse 23) Describe them.
- 7. What do you need to let Jesus restore in your life? What are you going to do about it?
