



Confession Profession

The purpose is to establish a conscious mindset to think what the Word of God says, to be able to march into the presence of God, ignoring our circumstances around us. Confession means 'to say the same thing as'. So whatever Jesus is saying to the Father on our behalf, we speak it when we come into His presence. Now, we do not come into His presence through praise. We come into His presence with praise through the Blood of the Everlasting Covenant.

Hebrews 3:1

“Wherefore, holy brethren, partakers of the heavenly calling, consider the Apostle and High Priest of our profession, Christ Jesus.”

The word confession and profession in Greek are the same one. So we are to consider the Apostle and High Priest of our confession. Jesus is.

Hebrews 4:14

“Seeing then that we have a great high priest, that is passed into the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast our profession.”

Jesus is the High Priest and Apostle of our confession and then it says that Jesus is passed unto the heavens, let us hold fast to our confession of faith.

Hebrews 10:23

“Let us hold fast the profession of our faith without wavering; (for he is faithful that promised;)”

Those 3 scriptures say that there is a confession of faith and this is a different confession than the confession of sin that is spoken in Mark 1:5 and James 5:16.

You need to know the confession by heart because if you don't know it, how can you teach it? True teaching is imparting the reality of what you've got.

Proverbs 4:20,21

“My son attend to My Words, incline thy ear unto My sayings. Let them not depart from thine eyes; keep them in the midst of thine heart.”

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Proverbs 23:7a

“For as he thinketh in his heart so is he...”

Remember ‘confession’ means ‘to say the same thing as’. So let’s say what the Word of God says about the Blood of the Lamb does for us.

It is written in
Psalms 107:2

“Let the redeemed of the Lord SAY SO, whom He has redeemed (delivered) out of the hand of the enemy.”

Revelation 12:11

“I overcome by testifying to what the word of God says the Blood of the Covenant of the Lord Jesus-Christ does for me. I don’t care if I die in the process.”

It is written in Eph. 1:7, “By the Blood of the Covenant of the Lord Jesus-Christ I have been redeemed out of the hand of the wicked one.”

It is also written in Eph. 1:7, “By the Blood of the Covenant of the Lord Jesus-Christ I have the forgiveness of all my sins.”

It is written in 1 John 1:7, “By the Blood of the Covenant of the Lord Jesus-Christ I have been cleansed from all my sin; i.e I am continuously cleansed continually from the root of all my sin by the Blood of the Covenant of the Lord Jesus-Christ.”

It is written in Ro. 5:9, “By the Blood of the Covenant of the Lord Jesus-Christ, I have been justified. I have been made “just as if I’d” never sinned, by the Blood of the Everlasting Covenant.”

It is written in Heb. 13:12, “By the Blood of the Covenant of the Lord Jesus-Christ, I have been sanctified. I have been made holy. I have been “set apart” by God, for God, to God, through God, by the Blood of His Everlasting Covenant.”

It is written in 1 Cor. 6: 13,19,20, “By the Blood of the Covenant of the Lord Jesus-Christ, my body is for the Lord, and the Lord is for my body, I don’t belong to myself, I belong to Almighty God. He bought me with the Blood of the Covenant of the Lord Jesus-Christ.”

“Now because I have been redeemed, delivered, forgiven, cleansed, justified, sanctified, and because God is for my body and I don’t belong to myself, I therefore declare to all principalities and powers, you have no power or authority over me, in me, around me, because of the power of the Blood of the Everlasting Covenant of the Lord Jesus-Christ, my Savior.”
