



COMMUNITY GROUP DISCUSSION GUIDE

Week of 11/9/25

Opener (10 minutes or less)

If you could multiply *one thing* in your life right now (besides money), what would it be and why?

DISCUSSION (50 minutes or less)

Begin your discussion time in prayer.

Scripture Reading: 2 Kings 4:1-7

Questions:

1. How have you experienced great need sometimes being the doorway to deeper faith?
 2. Why do you think God often begins His miracles with the little we already have? How does this principle challenge the way we view our resources, time, or abilities?
 3. What does this teach us about the relationship between faith, obedience, and God's provision?
 4. What does this suggest about the importance of spiritual expectancy and preparation? How might our "empty jars" today represent our capacity for God's blessings?
 5. How does this show that God often works through community to meet needs? What role does the body of Christ play in helping one another experience God's provision?
 6. How did God go above and beyond their immediate needs?
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PERSONAL (30 minutes or less)

1. Oikos - the 8 to 15 people God supernaturally and strategically places in your life. Any oikos moments you would like to share..
2. What is going on in your life (note prayer requests and praise reports)
3. Pray

2 Kings 4:1-7

1 Now the wife of one of the sons of the prophets cried to Elisha, "Your servant my husband is dead, and you know that your servant feared the Lord, but the creditor has come to take my two children to be his slaves." 2 And Elisha said to her, "What shall I do for you? Tell me; what have you in the house?" And she said, "Your servant has nothing in the house except a jar of oil." 3 Then he said, "Go outside, borrow vessels from all your neighbors, empty vessels and not too few. 4 Then go in and shut the door behind yourself and your sons and pour into all these vessels. And when one is full, set it aside." 5 So she went from him and shut the door behind herself and her sons. And as she poured they brought the vessels to her. 6 When the vessels were full, she said to her son, "Bring me another vessel." And he said to her, "There is not another." Then the oil stopped flowing. 7 She came and told the man of God, and he said, "Go, sell the oil and pay your debts, and you and your sons can live on the rest."
