Group Questions

1. If you had a record of every dollar you ever wasted and could use it to be generous—what would you do with it? Who or what would you give it to?
2. Why do you think so many people accidentally live as not truly generous people? What keeps us from crossing that gap between desire and reality?
3. In Jesus' parable (Luke 12:13–21), what was the real issue with the rich man's decision to build bigger barns?
4. How can we tell when planning becomes greed?
5. Jesus says our money reveals our heart. What does your recent spending reveal about what you value most?
6. Greed is idolatry. What are some subtle ways that money becomes an idol in a Christian's life—even when they don't think of themselves as greedy?
7. Why do you think Jesus refused to get involved in the inheritance dispute? What does that teach us about his mission and our expectations of him?
8. The sermon said: "Generous people make a plan." What might it look like for you to plan your generosity rather than give only when asked or moved emotionally?
9. Of the five uses of money—spend, repay debt, taxes, save, give—where does "give" typically fall in your own habits? Why do you think that is?
10. How does choosing a percentage help us become generous people rather than people who occasionally give? What percentage might be a good starting place for you?
11. What are you passionate about fixing, healing, or seeing changed in the world? How might your generosity reflect both a grateful heart and a broken heart?
