“Grace” defined:

The unmerited favor of God toward His creatures.

“unmerited” = unearned, undeserved

## Grace / Mercy:

**Grace** = receiving God's undeserved blessings.

**Mercy** = not receiving our deserved punishment.

“The noun [**mercy**], and its derivatives, always deal with what we see of pain, misery, and distress which are the result of sin; and **grace** always [deals] with the sin and the guilt itself. The one extends relief, the other pardon; the one cures, heals, [and] helps; the other cleanses and reinstates. With God [grace] is always first and [mercy] is second.”\*

# Grace Quotes: A.W. Pink

“Divine grace is the sovereign and saving **favor of God** exercised in the bestowment of blessings upon those who have **no merit** in themselves and for which **no compensation** is demanded from them. Nay, more; it is **the favor of God** shown to those who not only have **no positive desserts of their own**, but who are thoroughly **ill-deserving** and **hell-deserving**. It is completely **unmerited** and **unsought** and is altogether **unattracted** by anything in or from or by the objects upon which it is bestowed. Grace can **neither be bought, earned, nor won** by the creature. If it could be, it would **cease to be grace**. When a thing is said to be of “grace,” we mean that the recipient has **no claim upon it**, that it was in nowise **due him**. It comes to him as **pure charity**, and, at first, **unasked** and **undesired**.”\*

Ascribed to God, **grace** is His voluntary, unrestrained, unmerited favor toward guilty sinners, granting them justification and life instead of the penalty of death, which they deserved.\*

## Grace/Gracious in Scripture:

The first occurrence of the word “grace” in Scripture is in **Ezra 9:8** (NASB):

But now, for a brief moment, **grace** [t<sup>ə</sup>hinnâ/תְּחִנָּה] has been shown from the LORD our God, to leave us an escaped remnant and to give us a peg in His holy place, that our God may enlighten our eyes and grant us a little reviving in our bondage.

## “Common Grace” defined:

- The sovereign grace [favor] of God bestowed upon **all mankind** regardless of their election.
- The volitional bestowing of God’s graciousness on **all people** in **all parts** of the earth and at **all times**.
- Includes every **undeserved** providential act of God’s restraint, goodness, and mercy toward the **sinful inhabitants** of this fallen world.



## “Common Grace” verses:

- [Psalm 145:9](#): The LORD is good **to all**, and His mercies are over **all** His works.
- [Psalm 145:15-16](#): The eyes of **all** look to You, and You give them their food in due time. You open Your hand and satisfy the desire of **every living thing**.
- [Luke 6:35](#): But love your enemies, and do good, and lend, expecting nothing in return; and your reward will be great, and you will be sons of the Most High, for He Himself is **kind to ungrateful and evil men**.
- [Acts 17:24-25](#): The God who made the world and all things in it, since He is Lord of heaven and earth, does not dwell in temples made with hands; nor is He served by human hands, as though He needed anything, since He Himself gives to **all people** life and breath and **all things**.

“The entirety of the rich life of nature and society exists thanks to God's common grace. But why should he continue to preserve such a sinful world by a special action of his grace? Does he squander his gifts? Is he acting purposelessly? Is it not because natural life, in all its forms, has value in his eyes **despite sin's corruption**? The love of family and kin, societal and political life, art and science are all in themselves objects of his divine good pleasure. He delights also in these works of his hands. They all together constitute, not in their mode of being but in their essence, the original order that God called into being at creation and that he still preserves and maintains, **sin notwithstanding**.”\*

“As a creditor gives his debtor [a] long time to [re]pay his debts, and yet forbearing kindness is abused by a profuse, lavishing, and intemperate life, and running more in debt; and as a gracious king acts of favor that gives a condemned traitor a long time to sue for a pardon is slighted and despised when he spends it in immorality, drinking, and gambling; so the merciful and liberal allowances of large seasons of grace the Lord grants out to **deeply indebted and treasonable sinners**, are signally wronged when the more mercy forbears, and God is slow to wrath, the more sin abounds [in us].”\*

## Titus 3:3-7 (NASB):

**3** For we also once were foolish ourselves, disobedient, deceived, enslaved to various lusts and pleasures, spending our life in malice and envy, hating one another. **4** But when the kindness of God our Savior and **His love for mankind** appeared, **5** He saved us, not on the basis of deeds which we have done in righteousness, but **according to His mercy**, by the washing of regeneration by the Holy Spirit, **6** whom He **poured out** upon us richly **through Jesus Christ our Savior**, **7** so that being justified **by His grace** we would be made heirs according to the hope of eternal life.
