


## 2 Major Manuscript Families

Byzantine Family Alexandrian Family

Over 5,000 Less than 200 manuscripts manuscripts

(About 95%) (About 3-4%)

Earliest Date: Earliest Date:

5th Century 2nd Century

Geneva Bible, KJV, NKJV

Closer in Location to WHERE the NT was written

ESV, NIV, NASB, NLT, HCSB

Closer in Date to WHEN the NT was written

- There is less than a 5% difference between the two families of texts, the main difference being the Alexandrian family is smaller (Mark 16:9-20 omitted, other verses and words omitted).
- No major Christian doctrine is impacted or changed by either (the most significant doctrinal issue is that the importance of fasting is weakened in the Alexandrian texts).

## What about the Dead Sea scrolls?

- The Dead Sea scrolls are ancient manuscripts discovered between 1947 and 1956 in eleven caves near Khirbet Qumran, on the northwestern shores of the Dead Sea
- Archaeologists have long associated the scrolls with the ancient Jewish sect known as the Essenes dating from the 3rd century BC to the 1st century AD
- The Dead Sea Scrolls are not used to translate Scripture but they can be used to verify it
