Weekly Study: The FIREWORKS — One Spark Changes Everything



### Overview

This study explores the power of a single spark and how God uses fire as a symbol of His presence, power, and movement. Just as natural fire spreads, multiplies, and transforms everything it touches, the fire of God works the same way. Scripture shows a consistent pattern: **fire falls where there is an altar**. From Aaron to Gideon, David, Solomon, Elijah, and the believers in Acts 2, God responds to surrender and sacrifice with supernatural fire. Today, God still seeks living altars. When believers present themselves fully to Him, His fire ignites revival, transformation, and lasting spiritual movement.

### Key Points

#### One Spark Can Change Everything

- **Fire spreads and multiplies.** One spark can ignite a chain reaction that transforms lives, families, churches, and communities.
- **Pentecost began with a spark.** In Acts 2:3–4, tongues of fire rested on each believer and “they were all filled with the Holy Spirit,” showing that one moment of divine fire can ignite global transformation.

#### Fire Falls Where There Is an Altar

- **Scripture shows a consistent pattern.** In Leviticus 9:24, “fire blazed forth from the Lord’s presence” only after the offering was placed on the altar. God responds to surrender.
- **God honors sacrifice and obedience.** When David built an altar, 1 Chronicles 21:26 says “the Lord answered him by sending fire from heaven,” revealing that God meets us where we yield ourselves.

#### In Acts 2, the Altar Shifted From Stone to Spirit

- **Believers became the sacrifice.** Romans 12:1 calls us to “present your bodies a living sacrifice,” showing that the altar is now internal and personal.




- **God's fire rests on surrendered lives.** According to 1 Peter 2:5, believers are “living stones” offering spiritual sacrifices, meaning God's fire falls on people who yield themselves fully.

### Revival Still Requires an Altar Today

- **Many want the fire but not the altar.** We desire power without prayer, revival without repentance, and Pentecost without preparation.
- **The greatest need of the church is still an altar.** God sends fire where there is humility, surrender, and a place prepared for His presence, just as He did in 2 Chronicles 7:1 when “fire flashed down from heaven.”
