Weekly Study: Victory In Jesus



Real spiritual victory doesn't come from what's happening around you; it comes from the One who lives within you! This week's study reminds us that victory in Jesus isn't a future hope but a present reality. We're not fighting for victory; we're living in it. On the cross, Jesus didn't say "to be continued", He said, "It is finished." That means the battle is over, the debt is paid, and the outcome is secure. Now, our call is to walk in that victory daily, with boldness, faith, and holy confidence.



**1 Corinthians 15:55-57** (NKJV) "O Death, where is your sting? O Hades, where is your victory?" **56** The sting of death is sin, and the strength of sin is the law. **57** But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ!" **Romans 8:37 (NLT)** – "No, despite all these things, overwhelming victory is ours through Christ, who loved us." **John 19:30 (NLT)** – On the cross, Jesus said, "It is finished!" Then he bowed his head and gave up his spirit.



## **Our Victory is Already Won**

- The cross, the tomb, and the blood have already done the work. Jesus didn't say "To be continued," but He declared "It is finished" (John 19:30). The battle is over, the debt is paid, and the victory is sealed.
- We fight from confidence, not fear. Because the enemy has already been defeated, we don't live defeated, wait to celebrate, or wonder if we'll win; we walk boldly in what's already been settled.

## **Our Victory Is Lived Out Daily**

- **Victory is a mindset, not a moment.** We don't just celebrate on Sunday, but we walk in confidence every day, knowing the cross has already settled it.
- Victory starts in your thoughts, words, and worship. Guard your mind, speak life, and practice
  your praise, because that's how you live like a conqueror.
- **Victory is exercised, not earned.** Like a soldier walking through conquered territory, we move forward in faith, securing what Jesus already won.

## Victory Doesn't Mean the Battle's Easy, but the Outcome is Certain

- o Victory doesn't erase the battle, but it secures the outcome. Life may bring tears, struggles, and setbacks, but in Christ, we rise, stand, and overcome.
- o **Daily victory is powered by resurrection confidence.** Even when the fight is hard, we walk forward knowing the outcome is settled and the promise is sure. On the cross, Jesus declared our triumph at Calvary.
