LEVITICUS	<i>Priestly Instruction</i>	Leviticus 16:1-34	1,450 B.C.
NUMBERS	<i>Wandering in the Desert</i>	Numbers 6:24-26	1,450 - 1,410 B.C.
DEUTERONOMY	<i>Moses' Farewell Letter</i>	Deuteronomy 28:1-68	1,410 B.C. (circa)

GENESIS

- Broken Fellowship (Genesis 3:1-24)
- A Seed of Hope (Genesis 3:15)
- A Chosen People (Genesis 12:1-3)

EXODUS

- A Leader Is Chosen To Rescue God's People (Exodus 3:7-10)
- A Passover Lamb Is Sacrificed (Exodus 12:12-14)

LEVITICUS

- The Day of Atonement & the Scapegoat (Leviticus 16:20-22)

- The Lord is Abounding in Love Forgiving Sin and Rebellion (Numbers 14:18)

- Blessings, Curses and Restoration (Deuteronomy 30:14-15)

III. SO WHAT?

The whole idea of the Torah is that God has saved a people for himself. God saves us for a purpose...but he saves us first.
