# **Perspective**

**32** David said to Saul, "Let no one lose heart on account of this Philistine; your servant will go and fight him."

# Preparation

**34** But David said to Saul, "Your servant has been keeping his father's sheep. When a lion or a bear came and carried off a sheep from the flock, **35** I went after it, struck it and rescued the sheep from its mouth. When it turned on me, I seized it by its hair, struck it and killed it. **36** Your servant has killed both the lion and the bear; this uncircumcised Philistine will be like one of them, because he has defied the armies of the living God.

#### Praise

**37** <u>The Lord</u> who rescued me from the paw of the lion and the paw of the bear <u>will rescue me</u> from the hand of this Philistine." Saul said to David, "Go, and the Lord be with you."

#### Personality

**38** Then Saul dressed David in his own tunic. He put a coat of armor on him and a bronze helmet on his head. **39** David fastened on his sword over the tunic and tried walking around, because he was not used to them. "I cannot go in these," he said to Saul, "because I am not used to them." So he took them off.

### **Planning**

**40** Then he took his <u>staff</u> in his hand, chose <u>five smooth stones</u> from the stream, put them in the pouch of his shepherd's bag and, with his sling in his hand, approached the Philistine.

## **Prosper**

**25** Now the Israelites had been saying, "Do you see how this man keeps coming out? He comes out to defy Israel. The king will give <u>great wealth</u> to the man who kills him. He will also give him his <u>daughter in marriage</u> and will <u>exempt his family from taxes in Israel</u>."

## **Promotion**

18:2 From that day Saul kept David with him and did not let him return home to his family.

**18:5** Whatever mission Saul sent him on, David was so successful that <u>Saul gave him a high</u> rank in the army. This pleased all the troops, and Saul's officers as well.
