### John MacArthur on Social Justice

- John MacArthur "Social justice" (in the world's usage of that term) entails political ideas that are deemed sophisticated namely, identity politics, critical race theory, the redistribution of wealth, and other radical or socialist policies. Those ideas were first popularized and propagated in the secular academy, where they are now regarded as received wisdom and have become a dominating part of popular culture. Evangelicals who are chasing the culture are latecomers to the party of those who advocate "social justice."
- MacArthur has allowed no room for nuance in his definition

## **Evangelical Divide**

- Social Justice Warriors/Social Justicians a term used by those who think Christian's who engage in social justice are lost and have given to leftist ideologies
- Social Inacticians/Social Inactivist those who think ignoring injustice is biblically faithful
- Both sides lack humility and compassion

## Keep the Adjective or Not?

- The argument, in part of those that oppose Christian's engaging in social justice is the term, 'social' justice
- Justice doesn't require and adjective, it's just, justice
- There's a lot of argument over terminology
- Opponents of 'social' justice also oppose the term 'woke'

- Scripture was useless in the Athenian mind, so, Paul used a quote from a pagan philosopher.
- Paul coopted a phrase and applied it to one true God

- The focus is on semantics more than people

## Pharaoh's Sociology

- They will overtake us, so we must oppress them.
- We (Egyptians) must see them as a threat (socially and economically) to justify our oppressive acts.
- They're not worthy to be treated as humans, they're a commodity.
- Goal: Control and Domination.


#### What is Racism?

- Racism is the oppression of one group of people for the preservation of the perceived dominant group of people primarily based on race.
- It is the sin of partiality (James 2:9).

## **Curse of Ham Myth**

Because Ham was the father of black people, and because he and his descendants were cursed to be slaves because of his sin against Noah, some Christians said, "Africans and their descendants are destined to be servants, and should accept their status as slaves in fulfillment of biblical prophecy." - C.F. Keil and F. Delitzsch



### No Excuse

 The main problem wasn't that many 19th century Christians didn't have a Bible, but that they had capitulated to racist culture.

## Evangelical Response

- More Conservative than Christian
- Conflating Christian with Republican
- Theologically Hypocritical (Law > Gospel)
- Pro-birth NOT authentically Pro-Life
- Lacking compassion, empathy and love
- Labelled liberal and/ or Marxist
- Sees justice exclusively as an 'end times' occurrence

## **Christian Response to BLM**

- Agree with the sentiment, NOT every aspect of the organization.
- If all lives truly matter, then black lives are included within the 'ALL'
- Affirm black dignity and value, but don't deify it.
- Focus on the Imago Dei as the impetus for your engagement!

### What is Justice?

- Doing the right thing accordingly to God's standard of rightness.
- Mishpat means more than just the punishment of wrongdoing.
- Tzadeqah, and it refers to a life of right relationships.
- Rectifying justice is mishpat. Primary justice, or tzadeqah, is behavior that, if it was prevalent in the world, would render rectifying justice unnecessary, because everyone would be living in right relationship to everyone else. Therefore, though tzadeqah is primarily about being in a right relationship with God, the righteous life that results is profoundly social. – Tim Keller

### What is Biblical Justice?

- Starts with spiritual regeneration
- Gospel-rooted human flourishing
- Gospel-rooted meaning it's motivated by being saved. NOT a social gospel!
- Cares about the human condition from life to death to eternity!
- Justice disconnected from spiritual regeneration is futile.

# Doxy, Praxy & Pathy

- Faith and works MUST comingle
- Orthodoxy is believing the right thing and orthopraxy is living out what we believe
- Orthodoxy right belief
- Orthopraxy right action
- Orthopathy right emotions

# **God Loves Justice**

- The Rock his work is perfect; all his ways are just. A faithful God, without bias, he is righteous and true. -- Deuteronomy 32:4
- 5 The righteous Lord is in her; he does no wrong. He applies his justice morning by morning; he does not fail at dawn, yet the one who does wrong knows no shame. -- Zephaniah 3:5
- What should I bring before the Lord when I come to bow before God on high? Should I come before him with burnt offerings, with year-old calves? 7 Would the Lord be pleased with thousands of rams or with ten thousand streams of oil? #### **God Loves Justice**

 Deuteronomy 10:18 He executes justice for the fatherless and the widow, and loves the resident alien, giving him food and clothing.

# Acts 16:35-39

35 But when it was day, the magistrates sent the police, saying, "Let those men go." 36 And the jailer reported these words to Paul, saying, "The magistrates have sent to let you go. Therefore come out now and go in peace." 37 But Paul said to them, "They have beaten us publicly, uncondemned, men who are Roman citizens, and have thrown us into prison; and do they now throw us out secretly? No! Let them come themselves and take us out." 38 The **police** reported these words to the **magistrates**, and they were afraid when they heard that they were Roman citizens. 39 So they came and apologized to them. And they took them out and asked them to leave the city.

# Why was Paul beaten

- Seeking Justice slave girl set free,
  Magistrates (officers) and the crowd beat Paul (Acts 16:19-22)
- Disrupting an unjust system girl's owners were allowed to own her (Acts 16:20)
- Not being seen as a citizen Paul had dual citizenship (Acts 22:28)
- The Gospel
- Justice may not need an adjective, but it does require action

## **Greatest form of Justice**

- Gospel
- Gospel-centered social consciousness
- Social engagement is NOT a social gospel
- God loves justice (Amos 5:21-24, Psalm 33:5,
  Isa. 1:16-17)
- Discipleship is the greatest form of justice

## Isaiah 1:11-16

11 "What are all your sacrifices to me? "asks the Lord. "I have had enough of burnt offerings and rams and the fat of well-fed cattle; I have no desire for the blood of bulls, lambs, or male goats. 12 When you come to appear before me, who requires this from you —this trampling of my courts? 13 Stop bringing useless offerings. Your incense is detestable to me. New Moons and Sabbaths, and the calling of solemn assemblies —I cannot stand iniquity with a festival. 14 I hate your New Moons and prescribed festivals. They have become a burden to me; I am tired of putting up with them. 15 When you spread out your hands in prayer, I will refuse to look at you; even if you offer countless prayers, I will not listen. Your hands are covered with blood. 16 "Wash yourselves. Cleanse yourselves. Remove your evil deeds from my sight. Stop doing evil. 17 Learn to do what is good. Pursue justice. Correct the oppressor. Defend the rights of the fatherless. Plead the widow's cause.

### Seek Justice

- Black children make up 18% of preschool population, but represent half of all out-school suspensions and this is not solely due to behavior
- Black youth are 18 times more likely to be tried as adults than white children for the same crime.
- People with black sounding names have to send out 50% more resumes just to get a call back.
- If a black person kills a white person they're twice as likely to receive the death sentence than if a white person kills a black person

### **Seek Justice**

- Social justice comes from salvation, it doesn't replace it.
- Social engagement doesn't make you liberal theologically, it makes you loving.
- Social justice is a charitable apologetic primarily for millennials and beyond.
