Pride destroys dependence. Humility develops devotion!

INVEST

• The first woe identifies the Babylonians as takers. Does your life reflect more of a giver or taker?

INSPIRE

"We want you to live inspired by the Gospel to invite and invest in someone's life and live on mission."

• In the midst of these woes verse 14 states, "For the earth will be filled with the knowledge of the Lord's glory, as the water covers the sea." Essentially, the hope of the believer is that there is coming a time when the knowledge of the Lord's glory will fill the earth. When His kingdom comes in fullness, there will be no more injustice. However, is there any hope for the present injustices we currently face?
