Loving Truth—The Way to Real Love, Freedom & Generative Influence

Scripture References

1 Samuel 3:9; 2 Timothy 3:16–17; John 14:6; John 14:16–17; John 16:7–11; John 16:13–15; John 17:17; John 15:3–5; 1 John 2:6; 1 Corinthians 1:2; John 14:23–26; John 8:31–32

Introduction

- Pastor highlights a cultural crisis: people voice opinions yet seldom listen—to one another or to God.
- C. S. Lewis' insight frames the sermon: "I believe in God the same way I believe in the sun; not because I see it, but because by it I see everything else."
- Aim: cultivate a posture of listening, embrace Scripture as God-breathed truth, and allow that truth to shape love, freedom, and influence.

Key Points / Exposition

1. A Listening Posture toward God

- Eli's counsel to young Samuel (1 Sam 3:9) becomes a model: "Speak, Lord, for Your servant is listening."
- Reject two faulty approaches to Scripture:
 - Textbook reading—performance, legalism, anxiety.
 - Novel reading—mere entertainment, emotional diversion.
- Healthy approach: hear God's voice personally; expect revelation of His love and guidance.

2. The God-Breathed Purpose of Scripture

- 2 Tim 3:16–17: Scripture is inspired, profitable for:
- Teaching – imparting truth.
- Reproof – loving rebuke.
- Correction – course realignment.
- Training in righteousness – ongoing guidance.
- Because the Bible is "God-breathed," it alone possesses life-changing power; humans merely deliver it.

3. Reading & Responding: The Source of Influence

- How we interact with truth affects personal growth, discernment, and the quality of our influence (generative or destructive).
- Generative influence: patient, Spirit-led presence that draws others to Christ without coercion.

4. Four Diagnostic Questions for Lovers of Truth

(Each links to Renewal's vision: follow Jesus, love truth, live generous lives)

- Restraint vs. Rebellion
 - Question: "To what degree is sin-restraint or sin-rebellion part of my character?"
 - John 14:6—Truth (Jesus) stands between Way and Life; avoiding truth leads to lost direction and deadened life.
- Reception & Repentance
 - Question: "How do I interact with truth about me—for me?"
 - Spirit of Truth (John 14:16–17; 16:7–11, 13–15) supplies help, guidance, and memory-healing so believers can welcome conviction and change.

- Mortification & Sanctification
 - Question: “Am I vulnerable enough for the Lord to slay my lawlessness?”
 - John 17:17; 15:3–5; 1 John 2:6—only abiding in the word separates us from sin and conforms us to Christ.
- Liberation & Deliverance into Love
 - Question: “Am I daily delivered from personal wickedness into deeper Christ-likeness?”
 - John 14:23–26—obedience to truth ushers believers into a fuller experience of the Father’s love, enabling them to love others.
 - Truth → Love → Generative Influence → True Freedom (John 8:31–32).

Major Lessons & Revelations

- Truth is not abstract; it is the Person of Jesus.
- Scripture’s reproof, correction, and training are gifts, not threats.
- The Holy Spirit is “the Spirit of Truth,” resident teacher and healer.
- Love is always responsive—first received from God, then released to others.
- Freedom is the by-product of abiding in truth and walking in love.

Practical Application

- Begin every Bible reading with Samuel’s prayer: “Speak, Lord; Your servant is listening.”
- Schedule regular, unhurried Scripture time—neither performance-driven nor entertainment-driven.
- Invite the Spirit to examine rebellion; note areas needing course correction.
- Answer the four diagnostic questions in journaling or accountability conversations.
- Act promptly on convictions—repent, realign, and practice new obedience.
- Express God’s love generatively: serve, speak truth gently, avoid coercion, trust God to draw people.

Conclusion & Call to Response

The future of everything is Christ. His truth illuminates the way, imparts life, and forms love that sets others free. Commit today to be a church—and a person—who loves truth, abides in Christ, and becomes a Spirit-empowered conduit of generative influence.
