**A.** Saint: We speak truth when we answer the questions, "What is good in his life? Where is he keeping in step with the Spirit? How can I cheer him on?"

**B.** Sufferer: We speak truth when we answer the questions, "What is hard in his life? Where is he lamenting? How can I be an agent of comfort in those hard places?"

C. Sinner: We speak truth when we answer the questions, "What is bad in his life? What does he need to repent of? How can I confront him in a way that invites him into God's change?"

#### **Homework Sheet**

We would encourage you to use this worksheet to apply something you learned today. Developing godly communication requires intentionality. Prayerfully consider the questions below.
