# SUMMARY

Pastor Frank taught a message entitled, "Behind Enemy Lines" from Nehemiah 6:1-14. In this passage we saw Nehemiah's enemies hard at work, trying to stop the work. We learned some important lessons from Nehemiah on how to respond to these enemy attacks.

### 1. FEIGNED FRIENDSHIP

- Nehemiah was able to see through their deception because of his weapon of *discernment*. At its core, what is discernment?
- When we surround ourselves with greater amounts of truth, we are better able to discern lies and half-truths. What is one step you can take now to be a pursuer of truth?

## 2. FALSE ACCUSATION

- Nehemiah was falsely accused. Talk about the feelings and emotions that someone has when they are falsely accused of something.
- Although he was falsely accused, Nehemiah's weapon to combat the accusation was *determination*. How can you grow in your determination to do what God has called you to do no matter what?

#### 3. FEAR

- They used fear to try to get Nehemiah to do the thing that God forbade. Why does the enemy love to use fear?
- Nehemiah's weapon against fear was *devotion*. How can your devotion to the Lord grow in the midst of your fear?

**PRAYER** Pray that as the enemy attacks, we'd employ our weapons of warfare well.
