APPLICATION QUESTIONS

“Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says.” James 1:22 NIV

SUMMARY

Pastor Billy taught a timely, powerful message entitled “The Greatest Battle Never Fought” from 2 Chronicles 21:1-30. We learned practical truths about how to trust God with the battles of life.

- 1. Fear is a fairly common response when we face trials. The first part of verse 3 says, “And Jehoshaphat feared...”**
 - *In what ways have you allowed fear into your life recently? Why is fear so destructive?*
- 2. The second part of verse 3 says King Jehoshaphat chose not to live in fear. Instead, he chose to “...set himself to seek the Lord, and proclaimed a fast throughout all Judah”.**
 - *In those moments of fear, what keeps you praying and seeking the Lord?*
- 3. In verses 5-11 King Jehoshaphat prays, declaring the greatness of God and remembering God’s faithfulness to them in the past.**
 - *Discuss how God has been faithful to you in the past. If you can, share a specific example.*
- 4. From verse 12 we learned that sometimes God will take us to impossible places to bring us to the place of surrender.**
 - *What does it look like for you this week to surrender your fears to the Lord and keep your eyes on Him?*

APPLICATION

- 5. We learned in verses 14-17 that our responsibility is “now faith” and that God is responsible for “how faith”.**
 - *How can you rely on the Lord in greater ways to work out the details, rather than trying to figure it all out yourself?*
- 6. Verse 30 taught us that some battles aren’t our battles because they are too big for us - rather, they are the Lord’s and He’ll fight for us.**
 - *If you’re facing a battle that too big for you, how can you be still this week and trust the Lord to fight for you?*

PRAYER

Pray that God would fight our battles as we keep our eyes on Him!
