## APPLICATION QUESTIONS

“Do not merely listen to the Word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says.” James 1:22 NIV

### SUMMARY

Pastor Kenny shared a teaching entitled “Wonder-Full” from Luke 9:28-35 about the account of the transfiguration of Christ. He heavily emphasized the points of how we should continually be in awe of our Savior and His wonderful attributes. Pastor Kenny took us from the beginning of creation to the eternal glory of our Lord in Heaven. In it all, our God certainly wants to strike wonder in the hearts of His children!

**Definition of *Wonderful*:** Miraculous, to evoke wonder, to be awestruck, to marvel.

#### 1. Wonder in His creation (see Psalm 8:1-4)

- When was the last time something in nature gripped your attention?
- Is there a place you go, in nature, that makes you feel more connected or closer to God? Why?

#### 2. Prayer awakens the wonder of God.

- Prayer is not a monologue, but a dialogue. Why is it we tend to see prayer as a one-way conversation?
- Would you classify your prayer life as wonderful? What would it look like to move that direction?
- When was your prayer life the most satisfying and precious to you?

#### 3. Wonder in His holiness.

- As a group, make a list of the many attributes of God.
- Which of these brings the most awe to you about His Holiness? Why?

#### 4. Wonder in the presence of Jesus alone.

- The world's definition of happiness is often fickle and transient; typically a combination of many factors or goals attained. Has the wonderful joy of being with Jesus *alone* occurred in your life? When?
- When was the last time you spent *intentional* alone time with Jesus (outside of regular devotion time)?

#### 5. Wonder eternally.

- We have all of eternity to be in wonder of our God. What excites you most about heaven?
- “The most important thing about us is not what we think of God but what God thinks of us” - C. S. Lewis. What do you believe that God thinks of you? Why do you believe that?
