APPLICATION QUESTIONS

“Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says.” James 1:22 NIV

SUMMARY

Pastor Frank's teaching, entitled *“Look up: Life Lessons from the Lord of the Land”*, was the second message of a two-part exhortation regarding the current state of affairs in Israel. Looking at Ezekiel 36-39, he continued to share why God cares about the nation of Israel, the biblical evidence that supports this truth, and why we should believe in His promises.

1. Pastor Frank challenged us to read, on our own, Ezekiel 38-39 this week.

- Did you set aside the time to read through these chapters?
- Pause for a moment and think: if the United States were under threat, like Israel in Ezekiel 38, how would your faith guide your reaction(s) to the situation?
- God sometimes uses the conflict of war to demonstrate His holiness to the nations. How does this concept relate to the trials and tribulations in your own life?

2. **Life Lesson #1: Israel's existence today screams to mankind: God exists and He is faithful to fulfill all of His promises to His people.**

- How does God's promise to restore Israel resonate with His promise to restore us individually today?
- How do the descriptions of divine intervention and judgment in Ezekiel 38-39 illustrate God's sovereignty?

3. **Life Lesson #2: Israel's resurrection from the grave is tangible proof that we can expect one too. (See Ezekiel 37:1-14 and Romans 6:3-8)**

- What excites you most about being resurrected with Christ? Why?

4. **Life Lesson #3: Child of God, you're gonna make it in the end. Not because you're faithful, but because He is! Don't doubt His goodness!**

- In a world with many "Gogs," how can you uphold faith and maintain your relationship with God?
- How has God shown His faithfulness to you lately?
