

Definition of Revival: True revival is the sovereign work of God to reanimate, awaken, restore, or spiritually reignite Christians who've experienced a state of spiritual apathy, decline, and/or unrepentant sin that releases them into the fullness of His blessings for the purpose of Kingdom ministry and results in evangelistic fervency.
