- 1 Therefore, let us fear lest, while \underline{a} promise remains of entering His rest, any one of you should seem to have come short of it.
- 2 For indeed we <u>have had</u> good news preached to us, just as they also; but the word they heard did not profit them, because it was not united by faith in those who heard.
- 3 For we who have believed enter that rest, just as He has said, " AS I SWORE IN MY WRATH, THEY SHALL NOT ENTER MY REST," <u>although</u> His works were finished from the foundation of the world.
- V.4 For He has thus said somewhere concerning the seventh *day*, " AND GOD RESTED ON THE SEVENTH DAY FROM ALL HIS WORKS";
- 5 and again in this *passage*, "THEY SHALL NOT ENTER MY REST."
- 6 Since therefore it remains for some to enter it, and those who formerly had good news preached to them failed to enter because of disobedience,
- 7 He again fixes a certain day, "Today," saying through David <u>after so long a time</u> just <u>as has been</u> said before, "TODAY IF YOU HEAR HIS VOICE, DO NOT HARDEN YOUR HEARTS."
- 8 For if Joshua had given them rest, He would not have spoken of another day after that.
- 9 There remains therefore a Sabbath rest for the people of God.
- 10 For the one who has entered His rest has himself also rested from his works, as God did from His.
- 11 Let us therefore be diligent to enter that rest, lest anyone fall through *following* the same example of disobedience.

Review:

- Remember this book was written to **Jewish believers** who were being <u>persecuted</u> to the degree that they were considering going **back to Judaism**
- 2) God wanted <u>these</u> believers to **know** that the **second** covenant^(w/ Christ) is far <u>better</u> over the **first** covenant^(Judaism)
- 3) Christ is better than <u>prophets</u>, <u>angels</u>, <u>Moses</u>
- 4) God gives **five serious warnings** to believers in Hebrews
 - a) Warning #1. Don't drift away from the fixed truths of God's Word
 - i) **No believer can escape** Satan's <u>pitfalls</u> if they ignore what God has said.
 - **Heb.2:1** For this reason we must <u>pay much closer attention</u> to what we have heard, lest we drift away from it.
 - **V.2** For if the word spoken through angels proved unalterable, and every transgression and disobedience received a just recompense,

V.3 (NP)

- **V.3** <u>how shall we escape</u> if we neglect <u>so great a salvation</u>? After it was at the first spoken through the Lord, it was confirmed to us by those who heard,
 - *I remind you that the "salvation" spoken of here is not <u>just missing hell</u> & going to heaven. It is the salvation package that is being spoken of (i.e. <u>justification</u> – <u>sanctification</u> – <u>glorification</u>)
- b) **Warning #2.** The **second warning** we are looking at now be careful that sin doesn't harden your heart.
 - **Heb.3:12** Take care, brethren, lest there should be in any one of you an evil, unbelieving heart, in falling away from the living God.
 - V.13 But encourage one another day after day, as long as it is still called "Today," lest anyone of you be **hardened** by the **deceitfulness of sin**.)
- c) The background for chapters **3-4** is **Ps.95**
 - i) I realized we talked about it last week but every study has to stand on its own
 - ii) In Ps.95 the writer <u>warns</u> of the progressive nature of sin & its effect on Israel
 - **Ps.95:7** For He is our God, And we are the people of His pasture, and the sheep of His hand. Today, if you would hear His voice,
 - 8 Do not harden your hearts, as at $\underline{\text{Meribah}}$, As in the day of $\underline{\text{Massah}}$ in the wilderness; (the sin of $\underline{\text{Meribah}}$ produced greater sin)
 - 9 "When your fathers tested Me, They tried Me, though they had seen My work.
 - 10 "For <u>forty years</u> I loathed *that* generation, And said they are a people who err in their heart, And they do not know My ways. (the greater sin of <u>Kadesh Barnea</u>)
 - 11 "Therefore I swore in My anger, <u>Truly they shall not enter into My rest</u>." (explain)
- 4:1 Therefore, <u>let us</u> fear lest, <u>while a promise remains of entering His rest, any one of you should seem to have come short of it</u>.
 - 1) "let <u>us</u>"
 - a) "us" He is speaking to believers
 - 2) "fear...unless...while a promise remains of entering His rest, any...should... come short of it"
 - a) They <u>implication</u> is there is a <u>promise</u> that a believer **might not** receive

V.2 (NP)

- V.2 For indeed <u>we have had good news preached to us, just as they also</u>; but <u>the word they heard did not profit them, because it was not united by faith</u> in those who heard.
 - 1) "we have had good news preached to us, just as they also"
 - a) It is important that there is **no definite article** in front of "good news"
 - i) This is<u>n't</u> the "good news"
 - ii) Not referring to the gospel as we think of it
 - b) Your translation may say "we had the "gospel" preached..."
 - i) **The word** "gospel" means good news
 - ii) **Their** good news was **different** than **our** good news
 - iii) But faith was a prerequisite in either case to appropriate it
 - 2) "the word they heard did not profit them, because it was not united by faith"
 - a) They were <u>already saved</u> they had the <u>blood applied</u> to their door post
 - b) But they did not trust God to bring them to a safe place of rest
 - c) They were to go into Canaan & take it
 - i) Canaan represents rest
 - ii) They did<u>n't believe God</u> & therefore would<u>n't</u> go in
- V.3 <u>For we who have believed enter that rest</u>, just as He has said, "AS I SWORE IN MY WRATH, THEY SHALL NOT ENTER MY REST," <u>although His works were finished from the foundation of the world</u>.
 - 1) "For we who have believed enter that rest"
 - a) This is very hard to understand
 - b) It appears to say that **some have entered that rest** while **the children of Israel did**<u>n't</u> **enter b/c of unbelief**
 - 2) "although His works were finished from the foundation of the world"
 - a) He appears to be saying that <u>God had a rest for His people</u> planned from the beginning **V.4**
- 4 For He has thus said somewhere concerning the seventh *day*, " <u>AND GOD RESTED</u> <u>ON THE SEVENTH DAY FROM ALL HIS WORKS</u>";
 - "HE said somewhere AND GOD RESTED ON THE SEVENTH DAY FROM ALL HIS WORKS"
 - a) This is of course a quote from **Gen.2:2**
 - **Gen.2:2** And by the seventh day God completed His work which He had done; and He rested on the seventh day from all His work which He had done.

V.3 (NP)

- **V.3** Then God blessed the seventh day and sanctified it, because in it He rested from all His work which God had created and made.
- b) **WE know** that God was<u>n't</u> <u>tired</u> and that is why He rested on the 7th day
- c) HE rested <u>b/c</u> He was <u>content</u> w/ what He had created Gen.1:31 And God saw all that He had made, and behold, <u>it was very good</u>. And there was evening and there was morning, the sixth day.
- V.5 and again in this *passage*, "THEY SHALL NOT ENTER MY REST."
- V.6 <u>Since therefore it remains for some to enter it</u>, and those who formerly had good news preached to them failed to enter because of disobedience,
 - 1) "Since therefore it remains for some to enter it"
 - a) This has reference to the "Canaan rest"
 - i) This is the rest of sanctification daily living rest practical rest
 - b) What does this rest look like?
 - c) If you have the idea that this "**rest**" is the easy life let me explain
 - d) Canaan is a picture of that rest<<<
- **Josh.1:1** Now it came about after the death of Moses the servant of the LORD that the LORD spoke to Joshua the son of Nun, Moses' servant, saying,
- 2 "Moses My servant is dead; now therefore arise, cross this Jordan, you and all this people, to the land which I am giving to them, to the sons of Israel.
- 3 " Every place on which the sole of your foot treads, I have given it to you, just as I spoke to Moses.)**V.5**
- **V.5** "No man will be able to stand before you all the days of your life. Just as I have been with Moses, I will be with you; I will not fail you or forsake you.
- 6 "Be strong and courageous, for you shall give this people possession of the land which I swore to their fathers to give them.
- 7 "Only be strong and very courageous; be careful to do according to all the law which Moses My servant commanded you; do not turn from it to the right or to the left, so that you may have success wherever you go.)**V.9**
- **V.9** "Have I not commanded you? <u>Be strong and courageous!</u> <u>Do not tremble</u> or <u>be dismayed</u>, for the LORD your God is with you wherever you go."
 - a) The <u>rest</u> we are to find is <u>not</u> the easy life <u>it is</u> a <u>life of trusting</u> <u>God</u>
 - b) Canaan is a place where you <u>traverse flooded rivers</u>, <u>battle</u> <u>fortified cities</u>, <u>slay giants</u>
 - i) But <u>the rest guarantees victory</u> <u>b/c</u> God does the fighting
 - c) You may say that is no rest in my opinion
 - d) **V.9** pretty much sums it up **V.9** (NP)

- **V.9** "Have I not commanded you? <u>Be strong and courageous!</u> <u>Do not tremble</u> or <u>be dismayed</u>, for the LORD your God is with you wherever you go." (sometimes we have to learn how to not tremble)
- e) The man of faith **follows** God even if he is scared to death
- f) God **looks** at our **actions not** our **feelings**
- g) God's "rest" is defined differently than the world's rest
- h) God's rest has better benefits
- V.7 He again fixes a certain day, "Today," saying through David after so long a time just as has been said before, " <u>TODAY IF YOU HEAR HIS VOICE, DO NOT HARDEN</u> YOUR HEARTS."
 - 1) "TODAY IF YOU HEAR HIS VOICE, DO NOT HARDEN YOUR HEARTS"
 - a) Timing is everything in obeying God
 - b) Israel <u>decided to obey</u> & go into the promise land just like God told them to do **only** <u>their **timing** was **off**</u>
- **Num.13:25** (spies come back w/ report) When they returned from spying out the land, at the end of forty days,
- 26 they proceeded to come to Moses and Aaron and to all the congregation of the sons of Israel in the wilderness of Paran, at Kadesh; and they brought back word to them and to all the congregation and showed them the fruit of the land.
- 27 Thus they told <u>him</u> (Moses), and said, "We went in to the land where you sent us; and it certainly does flow with milk and honey, and this is its fruit.
- 28 "Nevertheless, the people who live in the land are strong, and the cities are fortified and very large; and moreover, we saw the descendants of Anak there. **V.30**
- **V.30** Then Caleb quieted the people before Moses, and said, "We should by all means go up and take possession of it, for we shall surely overcome it."
- 31 But the men who had gone up with him said, " We are **not** able to go up against the people, for they are too strong for us."
- 32 So they gave out to the sons of Israel <u>a bad report</u> of the land which they had spied out, saying, "The land through which we have gone, in spying it out, is a land that devours its inhabitants; and all the people whom we saw in it are men of *great* size.
- 33 "There also we saw the Nephilim (the sons of Anak are part of the Nephilim); and we became like grasshoppers in **our own sight**, and so we were in their sight."
- **Num.14:1** Then <u>all</u> the congregation lifted up their voices and cried, and the people wept that night.

V.2 (NP)

- **V.2** And all the sons of Israel <u>grumbled against Moses and Aaron</u>; and the whole congregation said to them, " Would that we had died in the land of Egypt! Or <u>would</u> that we had died in this wilderness!
- 3 "And why is the LORD bringing us into this land, to fall by the sword? Our wives and our little ones will become plunder; would it not be better for us to return to Egypt?"
- 4 So they said to one another, " Let us appoint a leader and return to Egypt (you can see why writer to Hebrews used this portion of O.T.) "
- **V.5** Then Moses and Aaron fell on their faces in the presence of all the assembly of the congregation of the sons of Israel.
- 6 And Joshua the son of Nun and Caleb the son of Jephunneh, of those who had spied out the land, tore their clothes;
- 7 and they spoke to all the congregation of the sons of Israel, saying, "The land which we passed through to spy out is an exceedingly good land. **V.9**
- **V.9** "Only do not rebel against the LORD; and do not fear the people of the land, for they shall be our prey. Their protection has been removed from them, and the LORD is with us; do not fear them."
- 10 But all the congregation said to stone them with stones. Then the glory of the LORD appeared in the tent of meeting to all the sons of Israel.
- **V.26** And the LORD spoke to Moses and Aaron, saying,
- 27 "How long *shall I bear* with this evil congregation who are grumbling against Me? <u>I have heard the complaints</u> of the sons of Israel, which they are making against Me.
- 28 "Say to them, 'As I live,' says the LORD, 'just as you have spoken in My hearing, so I will surely do to you;
- 29 <u>your corpses shall fall in this wilderness</u>, even all your numbered men, according to your complete number from twenty years old and upward, who have grumbled against Me.
- **V.31** 'Your children, however, whom you said would become a prey-- I will bring them in, and they shall know the land which you have rejected.
- **V.39** And when Moses spoke these words to all the sons of Israel, the people mourned greatly.
- 40 In the morning, however, they rose up early and went up to the ridge of the hill country, saying, " *Here we are; we have indeed sinned, but we will go* up to the place which the LORD has promised."
- **V.41** But Moses said, "Why then are you transgressing the commandment of the LORD, when it will not succeed?
- 42 " Do not go up, lest you be struck down before your enemies, for the LORD is not among you.

V.44 (NP)

- **V.44** But they went up heedlessly to the ridge of the hill country; neither the ark of the covenant of the LORD nor Moses left the camp.
- 45 Then the Amalekites and the Canaanites who lived in that hill country came down, and <u>struck them</u> and <u>beat them down</u> as far as Hormah.
 - 1) "Here we are; we have indeed sinned, but we will go" (V.40)
 - a) "Today if you hear His voice, do not harden your hearts"
 - b) The life we live doesn't have a "do over" or a mulligan
 - c) Today is all any of us have
 - d) Now he will change the content of the message to Hebrew believers
- Heb.4:7 \mathbf{x} He again fixes a certain day, "Today," saying through David after so long a time just as has been said before, " <u>TODAY</u> IF YOU HEAR HIS VOICE, DO NOT HARDEN YOUR HEARTS."
- V.8 For <u>if Joshua had given them rest, He would not have spoken of another day</u> after that.
 - 1) "if Joshua had given them rest, He would not have spoken of another day"
 - a) Corrected "He would not **be speaking** of another day"
 - b) David Psalm is still speaking of another day "today..."
 - c) **Jesus** is **better** than **Joshua** (which is Hebrew for Jesus)
 - d) <u>Joshua</u> could<u>n't</u> give the people the divine rest that Canaan represented
 - i) The enemies of Israel were never fully defeated
 - ii) The people never had permanent peace
 - iii) And only Jesus can give the ultimate rest that comes by trusting Him
- V.9 There remains therefore a Sabbath rest for the people of God.
 - 1) "a **Sabbath rest** for the people of God"
 - a) The <u>word for "**rest**" is different word</u> here than all other "rest" mentioned in this passage
- V.10 For the one who has entered His rest <u>has himself also rested from his works, as</u> God did from His.
 - 1) "has himself also rested from his works, as God did from His"
 - a) There are <u>3 rest</u> recognized in Scripture
 - i) The rest we have **when we trust Christ** as Savior we must rest from our own works
 - ii) The <u>rest **we fight for**</u> in **trusting Him thru this life** which we must labor to find & keep
 - iii) The rest **we shall have** when all our enemies are vanquished we will rest in His finished work
 - b) In each case **we must** rest from our own works to find the rest He has for us

c) The **rest the believer seeks** today is the **resting in His power V.11**

- V.11 Let us therefore be diligent to enter that rest, lest anyone fall through following the same example of disobedience.
 - 1) "therefore be diligent to enter that rest"
 - a) "be diligent" to exert oneself to labor make haste
 - i) Some things are worth struggling for God's rest is one of them
 - Mt.11:28 "Come to Me, all who are weary and heavy-laden, and I will give you rest. (I will rest you)
 - 29 "Take My yoke upon you, and learn from Me, for I am gentle and humble in heart; and <u>YOU SHALL FIND REST</u> FOR YOUR SOULS.

 30 "For My yoke is <u>easy</u> (kindly - virtuous - serviceable), and My load is <u>light</u>."
