#### Review:

- 1) Remember this book is about Jewish believers being persecuted to the degree that they were considering going **back to Judaism**
- 2) So the writer had to prove that Jesus is <u>better</u> than the **prophets**
- 3) Jesus is better than the **angels**
- 4) Now it's Jesus is <u>better</u> than **Moses**
- 5) V.1 is a key verse to this portion of Scripture
- V.1 Therefore, holy brethren, partakers of a heavenly calling, **consider Jesus**, the Apostle and High Priest of our confession.
- V.2 He was faithful to Him who appointed Him, as Moses also was in all His house.
- V.3 For He has been counted worthy of more glory than Moses, by just so much as the builder of the house has more honor than the house.
- V.4 For every house is built by someone, but the builder of all things is God.
- V.5 Now Moses was faithful in all His house as a servant, for a testimony of those things which were to be spoken later;
- V.6 but Christ *was faithful* as a Son over His house whose house we are, if we hold fast our confidence and the boast of our hope firm until the end.
- V.7 Therefore, just as the Holy Spirit says, "TODAY IF YOU HEAR HIS VOICE,
- V.8 DO NOT HARDEN YOUR HEARTS AS WHEN THEY PROVOKED ME, AS IN THE DAY OF TRIAL IN THE WILDERNESS,
- V.9 WHERE YOUR FATHERS TRIED *Me* BY TESTING *Me*, AND SAW MY WORKS FOR FORTY YEARS.
- V.10 "THEREFORE I WAS ANGRY WITH THIS GENERATION, AND SAID, 'THEY ALWAYS GO ASTRAY IN THEIR HEART; AND THEY DID NOT KNOW MY WAYS';
- V.11 AS I SWORE IN MY WRATH, 'THEY SHALL NOT ENTER MY REST.'"
- V.12 *Take care, brethren*, lest *there should be in any one of you an evil, unbelieving heart*, in *falling away from the living God*.
  - 1) "Take care, brethren"
    - a) This is a **stern warning**
    - b) Same exact wording in **Phil.3:2**

**Phil.3:2 Beware** of the dogs, **beware** of the evil workers, **beware** of the false circumcision;

- c) Who is the stern warning for??
- 1) "Take care, brethren"
  - a) Look again at who he is writing to "Brethren"
  - b) **Brethren** He is talking to **Christians** 
    - i) Can an unbelieving heart belong to a Christian? YES!

- V.12 x Take care, brethren, lest <u>there should be in any one of you an evil, unbelieving</u> <u>heart</u>, in <u>falling away from the living God</u>.
  - 2) "lest there should be in any one of you an evil, unbelieving heart"
    - a) **Faith** is the **sphere** / **domain** we are to operate in
    - b) We are to live in that domain we walk w/ God

**Rom.1:17** For in it *the* righteousness of God is revealed from faith to faith; as it is written, "BUT <u>THE RIGHTEOUS</u> <u>man</u> SHALL LIVE BY FAITH." (quote from Hab.2:4)

**Gal.3:11** Now that no one is justified by the Law before God is evident; for, " THE RIGHTEOUS MAN SHALL LIVE BY FAITH."

**Heb.10:38** BUT MY RIGHTEOUS ONE SHALL LIVE **BY FAITH**; AND IF HE SHRINKS BACK, MY SOUL HAS NO PLEASURE IN HIM.

- c) **Unbelief chokes out** our relationship w/ God
- 3) "in falling away from the living God"
  - a) "Falling away" word "<u>to stand"</u> w/ an "<u>alpha"</u> makes it negative
  - b) What the children of Israel <u>saw</u> w/ their <u>physical eyes</u> <u>turned them</u> <u>away</u> from what they should have seen w/ their <u>spiritual eyes</u>
  - c) What they saw w/ **physical eyes** was **more real** than what they could see w/ **spiritual eyes**
  - d) They did **not believe** God's Word is "falling away"
    - i) It is **described** in Mark 4
      - **Mk.4:2** He taught them many things by parables, and in his teaching said:
      - 3 "Listen! A farmer went out to sow his seed.
      - 4 As he was scattering the seed, some fell along the path, and the birds came and ate it up.
      - 5 Some <u>fell on rocky places</u>, where it did not have much soil. It sprang up quickly, because the soil was shallow.
      - 6 But when the sun came up, the plants were scorched, and they withered because they had no root.
      - 7 Other seed fell among thorns, which grew up and choked the plants, so that they did not bear grain.
      - 8 Still other seed fell on good soil. It came up, grew and produced a crop, multiplying thirty, sixty, or even a hundred times."
    - ii) Christ interprets:

Mk.4:14 (NP)

#### Mk.4:14 (NIV) The farmer sows the word.

- 15 Some people are like seed along the path, where the word is sown. As soon as they hear it, <u>Satan</u> comes and <u>takes away</u> the word that was sown in them. (Lost)
- 16 Others, like seed sown on rocky places, hear the word and at once receive it with joy.
- 17 But since they have no root, they last only a short time. When trouble or persecution comes because of the word, they quickly fall away.
- 18 Still others, like seed sown among thorns, hear the word;
- 19 but <u>the worries of this life</u>, the <u>deceitfulness of wealth</u> and the <u>desires for other things</u> come in and **choke** the word, making it **unfruitful**.
- 20 Others, like seed sown on good soil, hear the word, accept it, and produce a crop--thirty, sixty or even a hundred times what was sown."
- e) Who's responsibility is it that you know His Word? Yours!
- f) If you are in a church where you are not getting the Word leave!
- g) How do we battle against unbelief? V.13
- V.13 But <u>encourage one another day after day</u>, as <u>long as it is still called "Today</u>," lest any one of you <u>be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin</u>.
  - 1) "encourage one another day after day"
    - a) "encourage" is made of 2 words
    - b) #1. Beside / near- #2. To call = To call alongside
    - c) Checking on someone else encouraging them in their walk
      - i) Some of you can't imagine investing in someone else that much or someone investing in you!
  - 2) "as long as it is still called "Today"
    - a) **NOW** is the time to act! You just have today
      - i) Don't wait until you retire more convenient
      - ii) You are to be **concerned** for the welfare of other **believers**

**Phil.2:1** If therefore there is any encouragement in Christ, if there is any consolation of love, if there is any fellowship of the Spirit, if any affection and compassion,

2 make my joy complete by being of the same mind, maintaining the same love, united in spirit, intent on one purpose.

V.3 (NP)

- **V.3** Do nothing from selfishness or empty conceit, but with humility of mind let each of you regard one another as more important than himself;
- 4 <u>do not merely look out for your own personal interests</u>, but also for the interests of others.
  - \*God's economy is the opposite of the world \*These are <u>not</u> just words
- V.13 x But encourage one another day after day, as long as it is still called "Today," lest any one of you <u>be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin</u>.
  - 3) "lest...you...be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin"
    - a) What is the deceitfulness of sin?
    - b) It is to believe that a small sin doesn't matter that much
      - i) Sin is never inert inactive dormant
    - c) We tend to look at <u>big sins</u> & stay away from those: <u>Murder</u> <u>adultery</u> <u>theft</u>
      - i) We ignore <u>little</u> sins of: <u>Worry</u> <u>envy</u> <u>gossip</u>
    - d) It is **ignorance** of God's Word ruins our walk w/ God
    - e) **Not believing God's Word <u>causes</u>** you to **sin** when you wouldn't otherwise sin
      - i) Example;
      - ii) **Eve** sinned thinking she was doing the right thing!
- V.14 For <u>we have become partakers of Christ</u>, if <u>we hold fast the beginning of our assurance firm until the end</u>;
  - 1) "we have become partakers of Christ"
    - a) Word is only used one time in Scripture outside of Hebrews
      - i) Speaks of a partnership
      - ii) It has to do w/ camaraderie
        - **Lk.5:7** and they signaled to their **partners** in the other boat, for them to come and help them. And they came, and filled both of the boats, so that they began to sink.
  - 2) "if we hold fast the beginning of our assurance firm until the end"
    - a) This whole section is about living life as believers should live it
    - b) Being a **partner** w/ Christ thru life
    - c) It has **nothing to do w/ salvation**
    - d) It has **nothing to do w/ works <u>proving</u> salvation** <u>look at the</u> <u>context</u> of the verse
      - i) Where was salvation alluded to in this passage? Nowhere!

- e) God led Israel to the banks of the Jordan River
- f) They were <u>supposed</u> to cross the river & <u>go into Canaan</u>
- g) Canaan doesn't represent Heaven It represents the life of rest / Spirit filled life

## V.15 while it is said, " <u>TODAY IF YOU HEAR HIS VOICE, DO NOT HARDEN YOUR</u> HEARTS. AS WHEN THEY PROVOKED ME."

- 1) "TODAY IF YOU HEAR HIS VOICE, DO NOT HARDEN YOUR HEARTS"
  - a) Today is your day
  - b) Israel did**n't believe** God when He spoke to them
  - c) **What would life look like** if you simply <u>trusted God</u> for the things HE has said

# V.16 For <u>who provoked Him when they had heard? Indeed, did not all those who came</u> <u>out of Egypt</u> led by Moses?

- 1) "who provoked *Him* when they...heard...did not all...who came out...Egypt"
  - a) <u>Israel saw His wonders</u> they applied blood to their <u>door post</u> and <u>left Egypt</u>
  - b) But they did<u>n't learn</u> from <u>past experiences</u>
  - c) They didn't have faith to continue to believe God angered Him
  - d) It is a **walk of faith** to live daily for Christ
  - e) Apostle Paul **defined Christian walk** to Colossians

**Col.2:6 x** As you therefore have <u>received</u> Christ Jesus the Lord, *so* walk in Him,

7 having been firmly rooted *and now* being built up in Him and established in your faith, just as you were instructed, *and* overflowing with gratitude.

- V.17 And with whom was He angry for forty years? Was it not with those who sinned, whose bodies fell in the wilderness?
  - 1) "whose bodies fell in the wilderness"
    - a) The children who saw the most miracles of any single group lived their entire lives in the wrong place!
    - b) Two men out of maybe 1 million lived right way
- V.18 And <u>to whom did He swear that they should not enter His rest</u>, but to those who were disobedient?
- V.19 And so we see that they were not able to enter because of unbelief.
  - 1) "to whom did He swear that they should <u>not enter **His rest**</u>"
    - a) God has called on us to find our rest in Him

b) <u>Do you know what **robs most of us** of our **joy** – **unbelief** – not taking God at His word</u>

### c) What does taking God at His Word look like?

- **1 Pet.1:3** Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who according to His great mercy has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead,
- 4 to *obtain* an inheritance *which is* imperishable and undefiled and will not fade away, reserved in heaven for you.
- 5 who are protected by the power of God through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time.
- 6 <u>In this you **greatly** rejoice</u>, even though **now** for a little while, if necessary, you have been distressed by various trials,
- 7 that the proof of your faith, *being* more precious than gold which is perishable, even though tested by fire, may be found to result in praise and glory and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ;
- 8 and though you have not seen Him, <u>you love Him</u>, and though you do not see Him now, but believe in Him, you <u>greatly rejoice</u> with <u>joy inexpressible</u> and <u>full of glory</u>,
- d) That is what resting in Christ looks like
- e) Let's be careful that we don't miss it! 4:1
- 4:1 <u>Therefore, let us fear</u> lest, while a promise remains of entering His rest, any one of you should seem to have come short of it.
  - 1) "Therefore, let us fear"
    - a) There are things we are to remember
    - b) There are **things** we are to **forget**
    - c) There are *things* we are <u>not</u> to be afraid of
      - i) WE are told to **not fear** what men can do to us
      - ii) We are told **not** to **fear** the <u>future</u>
      - iii) We are told that **perfect love cast** out <u>all fear</u>
      - iv) **But** we are told **to fear** not entering into His rest!
      - v) That we are to fear!
      - vi) With that in mind I close w/ this admonition **1 Thes.5:16 (NP)**

## 1 Thes.5:16 Rejoice always;

- 17 pray without ceasing;
- 18 in everything give thanks; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.
- 19 Do not quench the Spirit;
- 20 do not despise prophetic utterances.
- 21 But examine everything *carefully*; hold fast to that which is good;
- 22 abstain from every form of evil.
- 23 Now may the God of peace Himself sanctify you entirely; and may your spirit and soul and body be preserved complete, without blame at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.
- 24 Faithful is He who calls you, and He also will bring it to pass.
