Christ took your place, so that you might take His.

He took our place:

- Barabbas Luke 23:13-25
- Simon a Cyrenian Luke 23:26-31
- The thief on the cross Luke 23:32-43
- The Centurion Luke 23:44-47
- The whole crowd Luke 23:48
- Joseph of Arimathea (vv. 50-53), Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James and other women (Luke 24:1-10), Peter (v. 11), two disciples on the road to Emmaus (vv. 13-27), all the disciples (vv. 28-43), Paul on the road to Damascus, the church....
- You have to be willing to tell Him you accept it in order to have it.
- Christ's sacrifice is our healing, if you are willing to tell Him you accept it.
- Will you decide today?

But, if that is why He had to die, then what is accomplished by the Christ who arose? If He took our place in death, does He also do something for us in His life?

Christ rose from death to life, so you might have life from death.

Seek life:

- Don't seek life among the dead (Luke 24:1-5)
- Remember Christ's words (Luke 24:6-8)
- Share the good news (Luke 24:9-12)
- Christ rose from death to life, so you might have life from death.

What Christ did will change your life, if you allow it.

The world does not have the answer, don't seek life among the dead, seek Christ who is living. Remember Christ's words and the blessing He intends for you. Allow Him to change your life. Once you have, share the good news with others.

Do you see Christ for Who He truly is?

- 1. ++Christ took your place, so that you might take His (Luke 23-24).
- 2. ++Christ rose from death to life, so you might have life from death.(Luke 24:1-12).

- 1. ++Jesus wants to be seen for who He is, not for what we want Him to be (Luke 24:13-16)
- 2. ++Be careful about who everyone else says Jesus is (Luke 24:16-24)
- 3. ++Let the Word of God open you eyes to Who Jesus is (Luke 24:25-35)
- 4. ++Accept the peace that only the true Jesus can give (Luke 24:36)

Don't look for a man, see the Christ of Glory.

Don't listen to who others say He is, listen to the Bible.

Only the true resurrected Jesus can give you peace.

Christ is not just a Prophet, not just mighty in deed and word, not just unjustly condemned and crucified, He is not just the Redeemer of Israel from other nations ...

- Jesus Christ is the risen Christ
- Jesus Christ is the present Christ
- Jesus Christ is the Christ who can open your eyes
- Jesus Christ is the only one who can give you peace.

Christ revealed Himself, so you might

Do you know Jesus Christ for Who He truly is, the Christ that the Bible says He is? Then ask and let Him open your eyes to His peace.

The peace that Jesus gives:

- ++Can never be earned, except by Jesus
- ++It is offered, you just have to accept it
- ++Once accepted, it can never be taken away or lost.

It comes from Him if only people knew

Only through His grace can it be learned

It's offered freely, for all to receive
