## Service must be intentional and focused (Jesus girded himself, John 13:1-4)

- God completed what He promised (John 13:1)
- ++Jesus knew who He was in God's plan (John 13:2-3)
- ++Jesus prepared to serve, even Judas (John 13:4)

### Are you God's servant? - If so, then serve

John 13:1-4 – "Jesus' love was expressed not only in performing the menial service of footwashing but also in what this act symbolized: his humiliating death upon the cross by which spiritual cleansing was made possible (this becomes clear as the story unfolds)."[1]

# Service is necessary (Receiving Jesus' service was required, John 13:5-11)

- Jesus did what others would not (John 13:5)
- ++Peter was required to accept the Jesus' offering (John 13:6-8)
- ++The "washed" only need cleansing from traveling (John 13:9-11)

## Are you clean? - If so, then daily let Jesus wash your feet (1 Jn 1:9)

## Those who receive your witness, receives Jesus and through Him, God John 13:12-20)

- Some will receive the Apostle's witness (John 13:12-19)
- ++Those who accept the Apostle's testimony, receives Jesus and God (John 13:20)

#### Jesus has sent you, now will you witness? - If so, then witness
