Martha believed serving Jesus and His followers was her calling.

Romans 1:1 "1 Paul, a bond-servant of Christ Jesus, called as an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God,"

Romans 16:1 "1 I commend to you our sister Phoebe, who is a servant of the church which is at Cenchrea;"

Ephesians 6:21 "21 But that you also may know about my circumstances, how I am doing, Tychicus, the beloved brother and faithful minister in the Lord, will make everything known to you."

Colossians 1:7 "7 just as you learned it from Epaphras, our beloved fellow bond-servant, who is a faithful servant of Christ on our behalf,"

Matthew 27:1–10 "1 Now when morning came, all the chief priests and the elders of the people conferred together against Jesus to put Him to death; 2 and they bound Him, and led Him away and delivered Him to Pilate the governor. 3 Then when Judas, who had betrayed Him, saw that He had been condemned, he felt remorse and returned the thirty pieces of silver to the chief priests and elders, 4 saying, "I have sinned by betraying innocent blood." But they said, "What is that to us? See to that yourself!" 5 And he threw the pieces of silver into the temple sanctuary and departed; and he went away and hanged himself. 6 The chief priests took the pieces of silver and said, "It is not lawful to put them into the temple treasury, since it is the price of blood." 7 And they conferred together and with the money bought the Potter's Field as a burial place for strangers. 8 For this reason that field has been called the Field of Blood to this day. 9 Then that which was spoken through Jeremiah the prophet was fulfill..."

The crowd believed signs and wonders are the focus instead of Jesus

Psalm 78:32 "32 In spite of all this they still sinned And did not believe in His wonderful works."

Luke 11:16 "16 Others, to test Him, were demanding of Him a sign from heaven."

John 4:48 "48 So Jesus said to him, "Unless you people see signs and wonders, you simply will not believe.""

Luke 23:8 "8 Now Herod was very glad when he saw Jesus; for he had wanted to see Him for a long time, because he had been hearing about Him and was hoping to see some sign performed by Him."

Matthew 12:38–39 "38 Then some of the scribes and Pharisees said to Him, "Teacher, we want to see a sign from You." 39 But He answered and said to them, "An evil and adulterous generation craves for a sign; and yet no sign will be given to it but the sign of Jonah the prophet;"

John 6:2 "2 A large crowd followed Him, because they saw the signs which He was performing on those who were sick."

John 6:22–24 "22 The next day the crowd that stood on the other side of the sea saw that there was no other small boat there, except one, and that Jesus had not entered with His disciples into the boat, but that His disciples had gone away alone. 23 There came other small boats from Tiberias near to the place where they ate the bread after the Lord had given thanks. 24 So when the crowd saw that Jesus was not there, nor His disciples, they themselves got into the small boats, and came to Capernaum seeking Jesus."

John 6:26 "26 Jesus answered them and said, "Truly, truly, I say to you, you seek Me, not because you saw signs, but because you ate of the loaves and were filled."

John 20:29 "29 Jesus said to him, "Because you have seen Me, have you believed? Blessed are they who did not see, and yet believed.""

John 12:10–11 "10 But the chief priests planned to put Lazarus to death also; 11 because on account of him many of the Jews were going away and were believing in Jesus."
