## **TOWER OF BABEL**

Left untouched the world would repeat the same self-centered sinful actions that lead to the flood. So God mixed their language to force them to scatter over the face of the earth.

## **GOD CHOOSES A PATRIARCH**

The Lord had said to Abram, "Go from your country, your people and your father's household to the land I will show you. "I will make you into a great nation, and I will bless you; will make your name great, and you will be a blessing. 3 I will bless those who bless you, and whoever curses you I will curse; and all peoples on earth will be blessed through you." Genesis 12:1-3 NIV

God uses the least likely people to accomplish His purposes and to tell His story over and over.

## **GOD'S PLAN TO BUILD A NATION**

So Abram went, as the Lord had told him; and Lot went with him. Abram was seventy-five years old when he set out from Harran Genesis 12:4 NIV

And the two of them went on together. 9 When they reached the place God had told him about, Abraham built an altar there and arranged the wood on it.
