Jesus Is Not a Novelty

Hebrews 13:8–16

I. Truth Does Not Change (vv. 8–9)

- Jesus is **unchanging**, even when culture is not.
- Hearts are established by **grace**, not spiritual novelty.
- Not everything that sounds good is good.

II. An Altar Religion Cannot Access (v. 10)

- Our altar is **Christ Himself**.
- Rituals and religious performance cannot replace grace.
- Salvation is found in a **Person**, not a system.

Christ **alone** — not Christ plus religion.

III. Jesus Suffered Outside the Gate (vv. 11–12)

- Sin offerings were burned **outside the camp**.
- Jesus fulfilled this picture by suffering outside the gate.
- He was rejected so we could be redeemed.

The cross was costly, not convenient.

IV. The Call to Follow Him Outside the Camp (v. 13)

- Christianity is a **call to follow**, not observe.
- Identifying with Christ may bring reproach.
- Faithfulness sometimes costs acceptance.

Will I go to Him, even when it's unpopular?

V. Living for Christ's Tomorrow (vv. 14–16)

- This world is not our home.
- We seek a city yet to come.
- God is pleased when:
 - Praise flows from grateful hearts
 - Lives reflect good works and faith

God is pleased because He is pleased with His Son.
