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II. Jesus Was Born in the Flesh So He Could Identify With Us

Hebrews 2:14-17

- Jesus shared our humanity
- He understands suffering, temptation, and weakness

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III. Jesus Was Born in the Flesh So He Could Die for Sinners

Hebrews 2:9 • Romans 5:19

- God cannot die, but God in the flesh could
- A real sacrifice was required for real sin
