Text: Jonah 1:14–16

I. When Man's Way Fails

- The sailors exhausted every human solution.
- Experience and effort could not calm the storm.
- Revival begins when we admit our way does not work.

II. Accepting God's Appointed Means

- Deliverance required accepting God's solution.
- Jonah becomes the means of rescue.
- Jonah pictures Christ — the price paid so others might live.
- Salvation comes only through God's appointed sacrifice.

III. Salvation Brings Immediate Change

- The storm ceased.
- Fear of death became fear of the Lord.
- Sacrifice and vows followed deliverance.

IV. Revival Requires Our Awakening

- Jonah slept while others faced destruction.
- Believers still sleep while the lost perish.
- Revival begins when God's people awaken to the urgency of salvation.

V. The Cycle of Revival

1. Awakening from rebellion
2. Accepting God's way
3. Experiencing deliverance
4. Living surrendered so others may live
