Prayer Component #1 - Worshipful Adoration

1.2. In the Psalms we see praise mingled with other components of prayer, as worship undergirds these other elements.

Psalm 119 especially shows the interconnectedness of praise with other elements of prayer:

- → thanksgiving ("I shall give thanks to you" v. 7)
- → commitment ("I shall keep Your statutes" v. 8)
- \rightarrow petition ("Deal bountifully with Your servant" v. 17)
- → confession ("I cling to Your testimonies!" v. 31)
- \rightarrow separation ("I hate those who are double-minded" v. 113)
- \rightarrow etc.

Prayer Component #1 - Worshipful Adoration

- 1.3. *Praise* and *thanksgiving* appear to be virtually <u>synonymous</u> in many Psalms.
 - → Conceptually, praise especially mingles with thanksgiving (Pss 75; 103-105)
 - → Lexically, the terms express the main though of *appreciation*, acknowledgement, or recognition—whether of God's person, His works, or His gifts.
 - → Careful, neat distinctions between the terms cannot be maintained (e.g., "praise" is for God's person; "thanksgiving" is for His words).

Prayer Component #1 - Worshipful Adoration

Rosscup: "Both English words 'praise' and 'thanksgiving' are words under one umbrella—acknowledgement/appreciation/respect for God's excellent worthiness. Both give credit or glory or magnification for His **attributes** and for His **acts**."

If any distinction is to be made:

- → PRAISE: focuses more particularly on **God's greatness** in His person and His performance.
- → THANKSGIVING: focuses more on **our gratitude** for His person and His performance (i.e., it is our response to the direct and personal intersection of God's greatness **in our lives**).

Praise/Thanksgiving in the Psalms

- o (7pr) 41x: "sing praise"/"praise"
 - o With song/With Musical Instrument
- פ (חמש) \$2x: "rejoice"/"be glad"
 - To be glad/merry in/on account of/because of the person/works of God
- פ (חדי) 67x: "praise"/"give thanks"/"confess"
 - o To proclaim truth/Praise/confess God's perfections
- (לל) איני "praise"/"confess"
 - To eulogize/To proclaim/exclaim the wonderful/mighty/praise-worth deeds and person of God

2. THANKSGIVING

Thanksgiving is our response of gratitude for His person and His works, as we observe/consider/remember how God has intersected with and ruled over our lives and the lives of others.

- **Psalm 9:1** "I will give thanks to the LORD with all my heart; I will tell of all Your wonders."
- **Psalm 75:1** "We give thanks to You, O God, we give thanks; For Your name is near; Men declare Your wondrous works."
- 1 Thess 5:18 "in everything give thanks; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus."

Prayer Component #2 - THANKSGIVING

- 2.1. Thanksgiving is a dominant theme in the Psalter (e.g., Pss 103, 136, 138).
- 2.2. Thanksgiving cannot be separated from praise.
- 2.3. The refusal to give thanks is a chief characteristic of the unsaved.
 - → Rom 1:21 "For even though they knew God, they did not honor Him as God <u>or give thanks</u>, but they became futile . . ."
 - → 2 Tim 3:2 "For men will be lovers of self, lovers of money, boastful, arrogant, revilers, disobedient to parents, <u>ungrateful</u>, unholy"

Prayer Component #2 - Thanksgiving



"If all be a gift, see the odious ingratitude of men who sin against their giver! God feeds them, and they fight against him; he gives them bread, and they give him affronts. How unworthy is this! Should we not cry shame of him who had a friend always feeding him with money, and yet he should betray and injure him? Thus ungratefully do sinners deal with God; they not only forget his mercies, but abuse them. "When I had fed them to the full, they then committed adultery" (Jer. 5:7). Oh, how horrid is it to sin against a bountiful God!—to strike the hands that relieve us!"

Prayer Component #2 - THANKSGIVING

2.4. Thanksgiving is to be offered in "in everything" (1 Thess 5:18), cultivated in a spirit of authentic contentment and in the place of anxiety over the cares of this life.

This is the secret of contentment, to be able to "consider all joy" when various trials are encountered (James 1:2), and to "know how to get along with humble means" and also "in prosperity" (Phil 4:12).

This is the worry-free life, to "be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God" (Phil 4:6).

Prayer Component #2 - THANKSGIVING

Q: Why do we give thanks especially before meals?

A: The practice of Jesus and the apostles; a particular acknowledgement of dependency.

- Matt 15:36/Mark 8:6/John 6:11 "and He took the seven loaves and the fish; and giving thanks, He broke them and started giving them to the disciples ..."
- Matt 26:27/Mark 14:23/Luke 22:17 "And when He had taken a cup and given thanks, He gave it to them, saying ..."
- Luke 22:19 "And when He had taken some bread and given thanks, He broke it and gave it to them, ..."
- Luke 24:30 "When He had reclined at the table with them, He took the bread and blessed it, and breaking it, He began giving it to them."
- Acts 27:35 "Having said this, he took bread and gave thanks to God in the presence of all, and he broke it and began to eat."
- 1 Cor 10:30-31 "If I partake with thankfulness, why am I denounced because of that for which I give thanks? So, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God."
- 1 Tim 4-5 "For everything created by God is good, and nothing is to be rejected if it is received with gratitude; for it is sanctified by means of the word of God and prayer."

- o "For He is good"

 - YHWH is the definition of goodness and is therefore worthy of thanksgiving
- o "For His Lovingkindness endures forever"
 - פִי לְעוֹלֲם חַסְדּוֹ
 - Because His Loyal Love (hesed) endures forever/is everlasting/has no bounds
 - @Grace/Mercy/Love/Loyalty/Faithfulness all rolled into one...This is Who God IS more than what He does

- @ 7HWH as Creator (vv. 5-9)

- o YHWH as God (v. 26)

- o vv. 1-4: Give thanks because YHWH is God...and He will forever be God
- o vv. 5-9: Give thanks because YHWH is creator...and will continue to have dominion over His creation
- o vv. 10-16: Give thanks because YHWH is our Redeemer...and will forever be the source of our redemption
- o vv. 17-20: Give thanks because YHWH is the victor...and He will never be defeated
- o vv. 21-25: Give thanks because YHWH is a covenant keeper... and He will never forsake His Word
- o v. 26: Give thanks because YHWH is God...and He will forever be God
