Prayer and the Believer.

Prayer is communion with God.

 Whether through adoration, confession, thanksgiving, or supplication, you are coming before the throne of grace.

Prayer assumes God is God and you are not.

 You cannot Praise/Confess Sin/Give Thanks/ Make Request of a being that is on equal terms. To pray is to commune, but it also assumes submission.

- Ποοσεύχομαι: To petition deity to pray
 - The most generic of the terms
 - Confession Ezra 10:1
 - Intercession Genesis 20:7, 17
 - Petition Judges 13:8, 1 Samuel 1:10
 - Blessing Matthew 19:13
 - Generic 1 Kings 8:28; Matthew 26:36, 39, 41, 42, 44

- Εὐχή: To pray/To vow/To bind with a legal or moral obligation
 - Could bring emphasis to the fact that the one praying is bound to the one being prayed to.
 - Genesis 28:20
 - Judges 11:30
 - James 5:15

- Δέησις: An urgent plea/a request/specific petition
 Emphasizing the sovereignty and ability of the one being petitioned to accomplish what is being asked.
 - I Kings 8:28, 30, 38, 45, 52, 54
 - Luke 1:13
 - Romans 10:1

How Do We Pray?

The Model Prayer: Matthew 6:5-15

- Prayer is communication not incantation (vv.6-8)
- Prayer is informed from Scripture (vv. 9-10)
- Prayer assumes humility and submission (v. 11)
- Prayer deals with sin (vv. 12-15).

 - Adoration: Psalm 8; 148; 149; 150
 - Confession: Psalm 51
 - Thanksgiving: Psalm 138
 - Supplication: Psalm 140
