



Sermon Summary

Whether you've been in church for a long time or have never stepped foot into one, you're probably familiar with Paul's love chapter. In chapter 13 Paul gives a detailed description of what gospel love looks like. We can have spiritual gifts, knowledge, powerful actions, and incredible generosity but unless it is motivated by love, and empowered by Christ's transforming love, it's useless.

Key Passage: 1 Corinthians 13

Questions for Reflection and Discussion

Grow

What does the concept of love mean to you, and how does it align with the qualities of love described in 1 Corinthians 13?

Verse 4, love is described as patient and kind. Can you share an example of a situation where someone demonstrated these qualities? How did it impact the people involved?

Love keeps no record of wrongs (verse 5). How can we apply this principle in our relationships, and why is it important?

Go

Love always protects and trusts (verse 7). How can we foster an environment of trust and protection within our communities or families?

In what ways can we grow in our ability to love others as described in 1 Corinthians 13?

How can we express genuine love without seeking our self-interest, as mentioned in verse 5?
