This week we examine the subject of human sexuality and the dangers of sexual immorality. And, as with any aspect or area of life, we want to approach this issue biblically. It's crucial to hear and understand God's perspective on this subject. The big key to correctly processing the last half of 1 Corinthians chapter 6 is to understand the fact that, ultimately, our bodies don't actually belong to us if we are joined to Christ. Identify and talk about the places this idea appears in verses 12-20
