

## Sermon Summary

A reoccurring theme we see the Apostle Paul address in his first letter to the Corinthians is the temptation we all have to commit sin. In this week's Scripture text we find some of the most instructive and compelling verses about this important subject that we all deal with on a daily basis.

**Key Passage:** 1 Corinthians 10:1-13

### Questions for Reflection and Discussion

#### Grow

It's crucial to realize and remember that whatever sin it is that we truly struggle with—we are not alone. Read what Paul says in verse 13 of this Sunday's key Bible passage. Talk about what you think it means and what it specifically means to you.

In verse 12, Paul warns the Corinthians: "So, if you think you are standing firm, be careful that you don't fall!" What does this cautionary statement mean in the context of their spiritual journey? How can we apply this warning in our own lives?

According to Paul, what lessons can the Corinthians learn from the Israelites' experiences? How can these lessons be applied to our lives today?

#### Go

We should never get to the place where we feel we are not vulnerable or susceptible to temptation or sin. What are some ways we can guard against this dangerous mindset?

Running from sin and running to Jesus are the best ways to escape temptation. Think about and discuss how these strategies have or could play out in your own life.

How can the passage in 1 Corinthians 10:1-13 encourage us in our faith journey and help us maintain a strong spiritual foundation amidst the various challenges we face in our daily lives?
