



Sermon Summary

As we continue our series through 1 Corinthians, Paul continues to make a distinction between godly wisdom and worldly wisdom. Plainly put, true wisdom is only found in a personal relationship with Jesus and when we receive Jesus, we are given the Holy Spirit. Paul says that we need God's Spirit if we are to understand the gospel, if we are to have the message of the gospel, and if we are to make the right response to the gospel.

Key Passage: 1 Corinthians 2:6-16

Questions for Reflection and Discussion

Grow

How would you define wisdom?

Oftentimes in scripture we see the word "secret" or "mystery". It's typically used in reference to the God's redemptive plan. Read Ephesians 3:1-6. How should this truth shape our thinking and how we live?

In verse 10, Paul highlights the work of the Holy Spirit in matters of the gospel. What are some key characteristics (or roles) of the Holy Spirit in the life of the believer?

Go

What spiritual disciplines (prayer, Bible study, meditation on Scripture, etc.) could you practice this week to make you sensitive to the Holy Spirit?

How might you approach a person you know who believes strongly in the wisdom of the world?
