RELATIONAL CONNECT & CHECK-IN

If you could instantly master any skill (even silly ones), what would it be? **-or-** What's the most meaningful gift you've ever received?

GROUP DISCUSSION

- Read 1 Corinthians 12:1-26 and share anything that immediately stuck out to you. -

1) When you think of "spiritual gifts," what's your honest reaction—excitement, confusion, skepticism, or something else? Why do you think that is? How have your church or life experiences shaped your view of the gifts?

2) Read 1 Corinthians 12:4-7. What does it look like in real life when gifts are used "for the common good"? What happens when they're not? Can you think of a time you've been blessed by someone else's gift?

3) Paul compares the church to a body with many parts (1 Cor. 12:14-26). What part do you feel like right now? Why? (Be honest...do you tend to undervalue your gift? Or maybe overvalue?)

4) Think about the idea that spiritual gifts can be *perpetual or temporary*. How does this challenge the way we often think about discovering and using our gifts? (Think back over your life. Can you identify times when God gave you a spiritual gift "for such a time as this"? Are there recurring themes that might indicate a permanent gifting? Allow others to speak into that!)

5) Why do you think people sometimes resist, or are apathetic about discovering or using their gifts?

6) Why do you think God chose to work through a diverse body of believers instead of just empowering individuals to "do it all"? What does this say about His design for the church?

7) What are some practical ways we can affirm and encourage each other's gifts?

ACTION STEP

Spend time this week asking God to reveal how He has gifted you and where He wants you to serve. Consider taking one small step to use your gift—whether it's encouraging someone, meeting a need, or trying out a new ministry role at church.
