RELATIONAL CONNECT & CHECK-IN

What's a time you experienced a "communication gap" — maybe a language barrier, a misunderstood text, or talking past someone? How did it get resolved?

GROUP DISCUSSION

- Read 1 Corinthians 14:1-5 and share anything that immediately stuck out to you. -
- 1. Pastor Matt shared five general positions on tongues and prophecy. Which ones have you experienced or been taught? How has your background shaped your perspective?
- 2. How would you define biblical tongues based on the sermon and Scripture references (**Acts 2**, **Acts 10**)? How is that different from what you've seen or heard in other contexts?
- 3. Paul highlights prophecy as especially important for the church. How would you describe prophecy in your own words? (Leader: Encourage examples from everyday life, not just preaching.)
- 4. Read **1 Corinthians 14:24–25**. How can God use prophecy to reach unbelievers? Have you seen or experienced this happen?
- 5. Share a time when someone spoke a word of encouragement, truth, or caution into your life. How did it impact you?
- 6. Verse 12 urges believers to "strive to excel in building up the church." What's one practical way you can do that this week in your group, ministry, or daily life?
- 7. In verses **33-40**, Paul talks about worship being both free in the Spirit and done "decently and in order." How can Mosaic and you personally balance freedom and order in worship?

ACTION STEP

This week, pray each day for God to give you one specific word of encouragement, truth, or challenge for someone in your life. Then, share it humbly and in love, testing it against Scripture before you speak.

Lastly: How can we pray as a group for you? Be honest...
