## RELATIONAL CONNECT & CHECK-IN

If you could instantly become an expert in one topic, hobby, or activity, what would it be and why?  
Bonus follow up: What's something you know a LOT about that most people don't?

## GROUP DISCUSSION

**Read Exodus 15:1-21 as a group.** Share anything that immediately stands out to you.

- 1) Why do you think worship is often treated as something limited to Sunday mornings or music? In what ways does our culture condition us to allow it to become stale or routine?
- 2) "You can't respond in worship to that which you don't see." What do you think that means?
- 3) In Exodus 15, the Israelites responded to God's rescue with praise. What are some specific things God has done in your life that are worth remembering and celebrating?
- 4) **Read Psalm 34:8.** What does it practically look like to "taste and see" that God is good?
- 5) The sermon emphasized the power of observation. What distractions keep you from slowing down long enough to really notice God? Are you good at observing other things?
- 6) What is one attribute of God that you've experienced personally recently? (Can't think of anything, ask the group to help identify things they've seen in your life.)
- 7) What disciplines help you grow deeper in your walk with God the most? Are there some you don't understand or haven't been able to use successfully?
- 8) What's an area of your life that would probably change for the better if you were able to slow down and be intentional in worshiping and observing God?

## ACTION STEP

This week, begin your own "Alphabet of Praise." Each day, choose a letter of the alphabet and write down:

- attributes of God,
- names of God,
- things He's done,
- or ways you've seen His goodness.

Spend intentional time specifically praising Him for those things.

**Lastly:** How can we pray as a group for you as a group? Be honest...
