DAY ONE

Here we are embarking on our first corporate fast at Victory in 2026. I want to welcome all of you into this special time that we have set apart unto The Lord. The theme and emphasis for our journey this week is “ALL THINGS NEW.” This is going to be powerful fast. I believe this with all my heart. I believe this fast can be historic on many levels for us all. The Holy Spirit is saying – All Things New. And we say – yes, Lord.

There is something wonderfully profound that we discover in our own faith journey about God’s nature and character that He reveals all throughout scripture – He’s the God that boldly declares He makes all things new, and He’s completely trustworthy in this (see Rev 21:5 NKJV).

Is it really possible that God can make all things new in our lives? That may seem too good to be true to the natural mind. This will require us to be spiritually minded and faith minded to cooperate with God in this transformation of “all things new.”

Let us begin here today. In the book of 2 Corinthians, the Apostle Paul writes these words under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. “Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new” (2 Corinthians 5:17 NKJV).

This new creation is a revelation of what it means to be “born again” as Jesus explained to Nicodemus. (see John 3:3 NKJV) The new creation is God’s master plan of making all things new by the regeneration of our spirit. This is what Jesus meant by saying we must not only be born of water but also born of the Spirit to enter the Kingdom of God. (See John 3:5 NKJV)

Inside our union with Christ, the old has gone and new has come – much like the transformation in the natural creation order of a caterpillar into a butterfly. It’s a beautiful miracle.

When you study the Greek term here in 2 Corinthians the fifth chapter, concerning “new creation”, we learn that all things are becoming new and new again and ever changing and conforming into the image of God. The picture we see is us being changed by the power of His Spirit to bring us from glory to glory, faith to faith. (See 2 Corinthians 3:18 & Romans 1:17 NKJV) This is why Paul also writes; “For whom He foreknew, He also predestined to be conformed to the image of His Son...” (Romans 8:28 NKJV).

This is a powerful revelation for us to understand and grow in. Our purpose and destiny is to be conformed into the image of the Son. This should be our aim and our quest, and it comes by yielding and surrendering to the Spirit of God and His ministry deep within us. Never forget that the Holy Spirit’s ministry is at work within, and God is fully vested to complete all things which He has begun in you. (See Philippians 1:6 NKJV)

We have just experienced a very significant move from a former property into our new miracle sanctuary here at Victory. This is a beautiful testament of the goodness of God, His favor and the generosity of His people. I have sensed in my own heart that this was far more than just a move in the natural, but would also prove to be a move in the spiritual realm. God is establishing His divine purpose, and He is commanding us to believe with our whole heart and trust His leading in this process.

We are growing and changing in the midst of this move. We learning to move by His Spirit. We are learning to let Him chart the course. He knows the way – in fact, He is the way.

With that thought in mind, I want us to direct our attention to this powerful scripture found in Isaiah.

“Behold, I will do a new thing, Now it shall spring forth; Shall you not know it? I will even make a road in the wilderness And rivers in the desert” (Isaiah 43:19 NKJV).

This is the powerful force about the nature of God. When He comes to do a new thing, His creative power manifests and creates from nothing something profound. He is the way maker where there seems to be no way. He charts our paths and creates the road. Then he declares that He has the power through the river of His Presence to refresh even the driest places of our lives. God is not intimidated whatsoever by our “wilderness” nor our “dryness.” There is no place too hard for God. There is no place “off limits” for Him. Everywhere the river of His Presence flows it makes all things live and come alive (See Ezekiel 47:8-9 NKJV).

Unfortunately, sometimes in our faith journey, we can get stuck into a place of sour thinking, even hopelessness, due to the messy experiences of a wilderness which produces a way of thinking that tries to convince that – this area will never change. We start believing this circumstance, this challenge, this sickness, this relational breakdown, this insurmountable wall is immovable, unchangeable and far too messy. And God forbid, if we dare admit that we have believed this “thing” is potentially impossible for God to change.

Hopelessness is when we have come under the influence of a lie from the enemy. Satan has only fathered one thing – according to Jesus own words, he is the father of lies.

The Holy Spirit, Who is the Spirit of Truth and who guides us into all truth (see John 16:13), desires to expose the lies, so that we can repent (change our way of thinking), renounce the agreement with that lie that we have held onto, and activate our faith to believe God for redemption and to see His creative power make “ALL THINGS NEW!

I want to remind us all that there is nothing impossible with God. These were the powerful words spoken by the angel Gabriel to the young virgin Mary, who would be overshadowed by The Spirit and conceive the Living Word of God.

God is speaking over us as his sons and daughters right now in the midst of a crazy and dark world that He is the covenant-keeping God and He is fully committed to His vision of love over our lives to make all things new. We must let everything within our hearts believe Him and endure the process with faith and patience so that we will inherit the promises of God. (see Hebrews 6:12 NKJV)

When God declares that He will make all things new, He is giving us a redemptive picture and vision of what is to come. Do not underestimate the creative and miracle power of God. He is able and He is willing.

In this fast, I pray that we receive the redemptive picture and vision of God’s workings and process within our lives. I pray that your heart and faith will become freshly burning.

In 2026, God can make all things new in your vision, body, family, business, relationships, marriage, wholeness, dreams, finances and beyond.

We are going to believe God with you for miracles – miraculous turnarounds, fruitfulness, innovation, creativity, breakthroughs, healings springing forth, increase, revelation, soundness of mind, financial turnarounds, prosperity, marital healing and restorations, debts paid off, addictions broken, new dreams and restored dreams.

**“Then He who sat on the throne said, ‘Behold, I make all things new.’
And He said to me, ‘Write, for these words are true and faithful’”
(Revelation 21:5 NKJV).**

JESUS is faithful and true.
