I want welcome all of you joining in for this "HEART OF WORSHIP" fast. I have been anticipating this special fast Unto The Lord. As I began to approach this time and ask the Lord about speaking to us – I could feel the "drawing" of the Holy Spirit. I feel such fresh weight and anointing on the word "drawing." In the book of Jeremiah, The Lord says, "I have loved you with an everlasting love; I have drawn you with unfailing kindness" (Jer. 31:3 NKJV). God is moving freshly at Victory, and I believe that most are really aware of it – it is sacred and holy. There is fresh oil being poured into us.

As I sat down to begin this first devotional in quietness, I could feel the brewing of worship and these words flowing forth:
Lord this is my desire...to pour my love on You
Like oil upon Your feet
Like wine for You to drink
Like water from my heart
I pour my love on You
If praise is like perfume
I'll lavish mine on You
'Till every drop is gone
I'll pour my love on You
(Song lyrics from Pour My Love on You, 2001)

As we have set the focus and theme of this fast on the returning to the heart of worship, I am so moved in my own heart, because this is such a core passion of my walk with The Lord. I feel before I am anything, I am a worshipper. Before I walk in the responsibilities and privileges of being a husband, a father, a leader and pastor...I'm a worshipper. I love to give honor and glory every day to the Lord through my life – that is worship.

Bren and I pray each day that our lives bring The Lord Jesus glory. Worship is not just the times that we've set apart in church services for hours of songs, praise, soaking, flagging or dancing. Worship is the heart of a man or woman that is set on releasing the gift of honor, gratitude, thanksgiving and their soul exalting The Lord for all that He is in our lives. When our hearts can see the beauty of The Lord in our lives and in the world around us, we cannot help but lift a "thank you" which is a gift of worship to Jesus.

Worship is a "thank you" that refuses to be silent. In Psalms 30:21 (NKJV), it says, "So I will not be silent; I will sing praises to you. Lord, you are my God, I will give thanks to you forever." Worship is an ongoing and endless "thank you" to our King. I want to give thanks forever to The Lord with all my heart, soul, mind and strength. I want all that I am and ever will be to declare my love for God. Who is like The Lord? Who alone is worthy of all the praise, honor, majesty and glory? Who alone is The Eternal God and Ancient of Days? There is no one like the Lord!

I love to sing among the family of God and experience the movements and currents of praise to The Lord. It's like endless waves rolling in upon the shores...it's an eternal melody where our praises can go on and on. I love the musicians to lift anthems and choruses of worship and praise. I love the lifting of the banners and flags in honor of His name and character. But most of all, I love when my whole heart connects with Jesus in the Spirit, and I can bring the pure oil and pure worship of love – pouring it on The Lord. I desire my heart to be a pure offering.

I often think about the words that God spoke to the Prophet Samuel when he went to Jesse's house to anoint a new King for Israel. Before Samuel met David, he looked at all of Jesse's sons and especially

upon his oldest – Eliab. In 1 Samuel, it reads like this: "But the Lord said to Samuel, "Do not look on his appearance or on the height of his stature, because I have rejected him. For the Lord sees not as man sees: man looks on the outward appearance, but the Lord looks on the heart" (1 Samuel 16:7 ESV).

God looks deeper, far beyond the surface...God looks upon and into the hearts of men. He listens to the intents and motives of the heart. He listens for the melodies and rhythms of the heart – a soul that sings "thank you." The heart of worship is a heart set on devotion, purity, intimacy and union with Jesus. The heart of a real worshipper carries the special fragrance of love that is God's favorite aroma. God is attracted to humility, purity and a heart of gratitude.

Amazingly, Jesus told the woman at the well in the Gospel of John: "Yet a time is coming and has now come when the true worshipers will worship the Father in the Spirit and in truth, for they are the kind of worshipers the Father seeks. God is spirit, and his worshipers must worship in the Spirit and in truth" (John 4:23-24). Did you catch that? The priority of God is not seeking worship – but for real worshippers. God is seeking the hearts of men and women who have their hearts set on him.

Years ago, Matt Redman wrote a little song that went viral. A band from England called "Delirious" recorded it, and it became a global anthem for the Body of Christ. Here's the words to that heart cry:

When the music fades
All is stripped away
And I simply come
Longing just to bring
Something that's of worth
That will bless Your heart
I'll bring You more than a song
For a song in itself
Is not what You have required

You search much deeper within

Through the ways things appear

You're looking into my heart

I'm comin' back to the heart of worship

And it's all about You

It's all about You, Jesus

I'm sorry, Lord, for the thing I've made it

When it's all about You

It's all about You, Jesus

King of endless worth

No one could express

How much You deserve

Though I'm weak and poor

All I have is Yours

Every single breath

I'll bring You more than a song
