- 1. Nehemiah was a God-fearing man living in a *godless* culture.
- Nehemiah had become very <u>successful</u> without sacrificing his testimony for God.
- 3. Nehemiah had discovered his "God's purpose" in life.
- 4. Nehemiah was given a **project** by God.
- 5. Nehemiah began to pursue his God project. That's when the **opposition** began.
- 6. Nehemiah didn't say "<u>Why me</u>," he said "<u>Why not me</u>."
- Nehemiah wouldn't take shortcuts. He was <u>godly</u>, <u>honest</u>, <u>loyal</u>, and had <u>integrity</u>.
