## LORD TEACH US TO PRAY

Scripture: Luke 11:1-4

Introduction:

- A. All things are spiritual dependent on prayer.
- B. The problem is how to gain access.
- C. Saying our prayers but not praying.
- D. Christ's qualifications to teach us to pray.
- I. The Structure of prayer.
  - A. It begins with worship.
  - B. It ends with praise.
  - C. Theologically it *destroys every false concept of God.* 
    - As a principle of life, this prayer ushers us into an experience of <u>deliverance</u> <u>from sin.</u>
    - 2. As a basis of social relationship, it lays the only *foundation for human fellowship.*
    - 3. As a prophecy it reveals the world as it is now, which one day is to be transformed into the *The Kingdom of God*
- II. The Sequence of prayer
  - A. There are seven requests that are divided into two categories.
    - 1. The first part contains *three* petitions concerning God.
    - 2. The second part contains *four* petitions concerning ourselves.
  - B. Concerning God.
    - 1. "Hallowed be Thy name."
    - 2. "Thy kingdom come."

- 3. "Thy will be done."
- 4. A person learning to pray is being taught to put the glory of God before everything.
- C. Concerning our needs.
  - 1. "Give us our daily bread."
  - 2. "Forgive our sins, our debts."
  - 3. "Lead us not into temptation."
  - 4. "Deliver us from evil."
- D. This teaches us that in prayer God's glory comes should be preeminent.
  - 1. How often do we reverse this process?
  - 2. The pattern of pray that Jesus teaches us reveals our focus.
  - 3. What prayer is not!
  - 4. What prayer is!
- E. We need a revelation of God's glory.
- F. Contrasting the two parts of the prayer
- III. The first sentence of the prayer.
  - A. When we pray, we begin with His *<u>name</u>* and then we say, "*<u>Thy will be done</u>*."
    - 1. If we reverse that order, we pray to a God we do not know and that is *slavery*.
    - 2. Praying to a God we know and love as our Father makes us a *child*.
  - B. God's name signifies His character.
    - 1. Calling Him our Father suggests we are a *family.*
    - 2. This requires a birth.
  - C. Notice the use of personal pronouns.
