Bold Worship is:

Worship describes those times we _____ deliberately seeking an encounter with God in Christ. We cultivate our relationship with God and with one another as the people of God. God uses worship to transform lives, heal wounded souls, renew hope, shape decisions, provoke change, inspire compassion, and bind people to one another. Through worship, God actively seeks a relationship with us, pardons sins, restore relationships and changes lives. (Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations – Schnase, pp. 33-34)
