Insights for Dating...

1) Date prayerfully. (Genesis 24; 1 Peter 5:7)

Then he prayed, "LORD, God of my master Abraham, make me successful today, and show kindness to my master Abraham." ... "Praise be to the LORD, the God of my master Abraham, who has not abandoned his kindness and faithfulness to my master. As for me, the LORD has led me on the journey to the house of my master's relatives." Genesis 24:12, 27

- Look to date someone who can keep pace with you.
- 2) Date with clarity.
 - Guys, ask a girl out on a date.
 - Ladies, agree to a date.
- 3) Date graciously. (Isaiah 43:1)
 - Don't ever mistreat anyone.
 - Don't allow yourself to be mistreated.
- 4) Date with purity. (1 Thessalonians 4:3-8)
 - Don't do things that will lead you to lie about your story.
- 5) Date in community. (Proverbs 11:14; Proverbs 24:6)

Let's Talk About It

Many times, we learn from our mistakes in the areas that matter least, but we repeat our mistakes in the areas that matter most. Relationships are one of those areas. How can we ensure that next time won't be like the last time? If you don't want a relationship like the majority of relationships, don't date like the majority of daters.

- Which part of the message made an impact, caught your attention or challenged you?
- Read Genesis 24:2-7, 12. [Singles] What does "dating prayerfully" look like? [Marrieds] Why is it important to continue to date your spouse? Do you pray with your spouse? Do you pray for your spouse?
- Read 1 Corinthians 13:11. In relationships, why is it difficult to correct many of our past patterns of behavior? What's your initial reaction to the idea that "time is your friend"? Do you agree? Disagree?
- Look over and discuss the insights for dating Pastor Gregg shared. How can you apply these insights if you're single...married?
 - o Do you need clarity in your relationship?
 - Are you being mistreated or are you mistreating someone (verbally, emotionally, physically)?
 - o If a relative was being treated as you're being treated, would you be upset?
 - o You are writing your story. What story do you want to tell?
